# Congresswoman Sewell Joins Democratic Leadership to Urge a Vote to Extend Unemployment Insurance Benefits

**Washington, DC** – Today, Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell joined her democratic colleagues to announce the discharge petition introduced this afternoon to bring the Emergency Unemployment Compensation Extension Act (H.R. 3546) to the floor for a vote. Since emergency unemployment insurance was cut off on December 28<sup>th</sup>, more than 2 million Americans and 20,000 Alabamians have lost these critical benefits.

"The failure of my Republican colleagues to allow a vote on emergency unemployment benefits is a shameful disregard for the needs of more than 2 million people across this country that rely on these benefits. Unemployment insurance lapsed on December 28, 2013 for more than 20,000 Alabamians impacting over 10,000 children in those households," said Rep. Sewell. "Long-term unemployment benefits have kept millions of American families from falling below the poverty line for decades. This is why I was proud to stand with my Democratic colleagues today to take action and introduce a discharge petition to urge a vote to extend these vital benefits."

On March 6, Congresswoman Sewell signed a letter, along with 161 of her democratic colleagues, to Speaker Boehner demanding that he call an immediate vote to extend unemployment insurance. The letter highlighted that there are close to 200,000 Veterans among the 2 million Americans who have seen their emergency unemployment insurance cut off. Speaker Boehner did not honor this request.

**Washington, DC** – Today, Congresswoman Sewell joined freedom riders from Alabama at the U.S. capitol for a rally to underscore the dire need for Congress to strengthen the Voting Rights Amendment Act of 2014 to include Alabama.

"Our national history is full of stories of ordinary Americans gathering strength in numbers to protest injustices. Today, I was proud to join a network of organizations, including the NAACP, and a caravan of freedom riders from Alabama, North Carolina and across the nation to demand full restoration of the Voting Rights Act," said Rep. Sewell. "I was honored to speak at the rally today to further reinforce the need for Congress to strengthen the Voting Rights Amendment Act of 2014 so that all vulnerable communities, like those in Alabama, are afforded the protection of federal oversight. We must continue to march for justice and remain steadfast in our commitment to ensuring that no American is denied their right to vote."



The guide is a free web-based resource designed to provide counties and municipalities in the West Alabama region with information about available grant and loan programs for community and economic development activities.


The guide provides program details on major Federal and State programs including agency contacts; award cycles; grant ceilings; matching requirements; and eligibility factors.
