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# Federal Disaster Aid to Alabama Nears \$10 Million

Alabamians are urged to file for disaster assistance through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) if their homes were damaged during the storms, tornadoes and flooding between April 28 and May 5, 2014.

More than **6,600** residents' registrations have been approved in the nine affected counties in the two weeks following the presidential disaster declaration.

More than **\$9 million** has been approved through FEMA's Individual and Household program. The U.S. Small Business Administration has approved more than **\$650,000** through its low-interest disaster loan program.

The following numbers, compiled May 15, provide a snapshot of the Alabama/FEMA disaster recovery to date:

#### Funds approved

- **\$7.8 million** for Housing Assistance grants to help with recovery rental expenses and home repair costs.
- **\$1.3 million** for Other Needs Assistance to cover essential disaster-related needs, such as medical expenses and lost personal possessions.
- **\$650,000** approved by the U.S. Small Business Administration for low-interest loans to eligible homeowners, renters or business owners.

## Survivor recovery

- **3,583 of the 4,860** damaged homes and property have been inspected (74 percent of requests).
- 1,331 visits have been made to the nine disaster recovery centers located in designated counties.
- 9 counties declared for individual assistance.

FEMA works with many volunteer agencies and the private sector to speed the recovery effort.

But those affected by the severe storms (between April 28 and May 5) need to register with FEMA for disaster aid.

No matter the degree of loss or insurance, survivors are urged to apply for help. They can use the following methods:

- By phone, call 800-621-FEMA from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m., local time. Operators are multilingual. TTY 800-462-7585.
- By computer, go online to <u>www.DisasterAssistance.gov</u>.
- By **smartphone** or **tablet**, use **m.fema.gov**.

**County-by-County approved breakdown of Individual Assistance:** 

Recovery officials urge all Alabama residents who have registered for assistance to stay in close touch with FEMA throughout the recovery process. This is especially true during the first weeks after registering when FEMA Housing Inspectors must contact applicants to view damages. Those with mobile phones should provide that number to FEMA during the registration and/or a good contact number.

Affected survivors and business owners in the nine designated counties may apply for assistance. Those counties are: **Baldwin, Blount, DeKalk, Etowah, Jefferson, Lee, Limestone, Mobile and Tuscaloosa.** 

FEMA's mission is to support our citizens and first responders to ensure that as a nation we work together to build, sustain, and improve our capability to prepare for, protect against, respond to, recover from, and mitigate all hazards. Disaster recovery assistance is available without regard to race, color, religion, nationality, sex, age, disability, English proficiency or economic status. If you or someone you know has been discriminated against, call FEMA toll-free at 800-621-FEMA (3362). For TTY call 800-462-7585.

FEMA's temporary housing assistance and grants for public transportation expenses, medical and dental expenses, and funeral and burial expenses do not require individuals to apply for an SBA loan. However, applicants who receive SBA loan applications must submit them to SBA loan officers to be eligible for assistance that covers personal property, vehicle repair or replacement, and moving and storage expenses.

# Disaster Unemployment Benefits are Available for Alabama Disaster Survivors

Survivors in nine counties who have lost their jobs due to the floods and tornadoes from April 28 to May 2, 2014, could be eligible for disaster unemployment benefits. The deadline for this benefit is approaching soon and varies by county.

Those who work in Baldwin, Jefferson, Lee and Limestone counties but have been unable to work have until **June 3** to file for Disaster Unemployment Benefits.

Those who work in Blount, DeKalb, Etowah, Mobile and Tuscaloosa counties have through **June 9** to apply for unemployment benefits.

Those who may be eligible include:

• Self-employed individuals who lived or worked in the affected areas during the storm and those who are unemployed as a result of the storm.

• Workers who were unable to reach their jobs as a result of the storm.

• Those who were to begin employment but were unable to travel to the location or the business was destroyed due to the disaster.

• Individuals who became the primary or major wage earner due to the disaster-related death of the head of the household.

• Those who cannot work because of an injury caused as a direct result of the storm.

• Individuals who can no longer work or lost work as a result of physical damage or destruction of a business.

The program is funded by FEMA and administered by the state of Alabama.

The online Veterans Employment Center is the single federal source for Veterans looking for new career opportunities in the private and public sectors, as well as Service Members transitioning to the civilian workforce, military and Veteran spouses and dependents looking for employment opportunities, GI Bill beneficiaries transitioning from training to the job market and employers looking to connect with high quality applicants. It is the first interagency tool that brings together public and private job opportunities with resume building and other career tools currently offered on a variety of websites together in one place.

Through the online Veterans Employment Center, Veterans, transitioning Service Members and spouses are connected to high quality career choices by matching their identified skills with available public and private job opportunities. The site is built using an open application programming interface (API) to attract private sector innovation.

- Quick public resume posting with an instant connection to thousands of public and private employers
- Target job search based on specific, high-demand career paths
- Single search for both public and private sector positions
- Military skills translator and resume generator
- Social media integration with popular bookmarking sites for saving job postings

- View reverse skills translation (military to civilian skills) for applicants
- Set Veterans hiring goals and track progress

In connection with the First Lady and Dr. Biden's Joining Forces initiative, the Department of Veterans Affairs worked with the Departments of Defense, Labor, and Education, and the Office of Personnel Management to design and develop the site and incorporate features of existing online employment tools at each agency. The result is an upgrade to the existing Veterans Job Bank and an integrated solution connecting Veterans, transitioning Service Members and employers.
