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CONGRESSWOMAN SEWELL'S STATEMENT ON THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964

Washington, DC – Today, Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell (AL-07) released the following statement on the 50th Anniversary of the Civil Rights Act of 1964:

“Fifty years ago today, President Lyndon B. Johnson signed the Civil Rights Act of 1964 into law as a premier cornerstone of the Great Society. This monumental piece of legislation ultimately dismantled the structures of legal segregation so that America could live up to its founding principles. Today we know that this legislation is as fundamental to our democracy as the Constitution and the Bill of Rights.

We know, however, that passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 didn't come without a price. Today we honor the men and women who helped make its passage a reality. We celebrate the countless unheralded Americans who challenged injustice and built the movement that served as the catalyst for legislative change. We have lived out the legacy of their sacrifices and have enjoyed new doors of opportunity as a result of their efforts. Our future is ever reliant on our efforts to fully vindicate their vision.

Although the Civil Rights Act of 1964 represented tremendous progress, the violence in Selma on the Edmund Pettus Bridge in March 1965 highlighted the need for stronger legislative action by Congress. Just as the tragic loss of the Four Little Girls in Birmingham on September 15, 1963 burned in President Johnson's mind as he signed the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the events in Selma compelled him to introduce the Voting Rights Act of 1965. This is why we must remain committed to fully addressing the Supreme Court's ruling in *Shelby County v. Holder* by passing an improved and strengthened Voting Rights Act. I will continue to work within the bipartisan efforts being taken by the House and Senate Judiciary Committees to strengthen this foundational legislation.”

CONGRESSWOMAN SEWELL'S STATEMENT ON THE SUPREME COURT'S DECISION IN BURWELL V. HOBBY LOBBY

Washington, DC – Today, Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell released the following statement following the Supreme Court's ruling that the government can't require "closely held" corporations with religious owners to provide contraception coverage to their employees:

"The Supreme Court's decision to allow select corporations to withhold health care options to their female employees is a disappointing setback for women's health in our country. This decision represents a broad and dangerous precedent and is a slippery slope that could allow corporations to cherry pick which laws to abide by now and in the future.

I fully believe that employers, insurers, and politicians have no place in a woman's health care decisions. Make no mistake – the Affordable Care Act's contraceptive coverage requirement does not force a corporation to provide contraceptives or even encourage their use, but rather to simply provide their employees with health coverage so they can make their own health care decisions. Given that 90 percent of America's businesses are 'closely held,' I am confident that millions of American women and their families will be immediately affected by the Supreme Court's decision to overturn the ACA's contraceptive coverage requirement.

The federal government must take action immediately to ensure that *all* women have affordable access to comprehensive health care without interference from their employers. I will continue to fight on behalf of America's women to ensure they have full access to the fundamental health care they need and deserve."

The Rick Rescorla National Award for Resilience

The *Rick Rescorla National Award for Resilience* is the Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) first national resilience award for superior leadership and innovation by a non-governmental individual or organization who exemplifies the qualities and achievements of Rick Rescorla, emphasizing leadership in effective preparation, response, and recovery in the face of disasters.

Rescorla served as Vice President of Security for Morgan Stanley at their Headquarters in the World Trade Center. Following the 1993 terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center, Rescorla regularly drilled his Morgan Stanley employees in disaster preparedness and response, especially evacuation. On 9/11, Rescorla led a massive evacuation of Morgan Stanley's 2,700-person workforce located in the South Tower, saving the lives of all but six. His commitment to preparedness ensured that the 2,700 Morgan Stanley employees who worked in the South Tower knew how to evacuate and where to go on 9/11.

Eligibility and Criteria

To be eligible for the 2014 award, the nominee must be:

- An individual, residing legally in the United States or its territories, who is not an employee of a governmental entity – including federal, state, local, tribal or territorial governments. Volunteer first responders are eligible. This includes firefighters, emergency medical providers, and law enforcement personnel who serve on a volunteer basis.
- An organization, other than a governmental entity, based in the United States or its territories. In 2014, there will be two separate award categories for organizations, one for “for-profit organizations” and one for “not-for-profit organizations.”

The criteria for the Rescorla Award emphasize leadership and achievement in one or more of the following areas:

- Outstanding performance during 2013 in withstanding, adapting to, and rapidly recovering from natural or human caused incidents that impact lives or property, including:
 - Demonstrable success in saving lives, protecting property and the environment, or meeting basic human needs because of outstanding prior preparation and/or extraordinary efforts during or after incidents.
 - Outstanding leadership in assisting individuals, families, organizations and/or communities in response or recovery from natural or human-caused incidents.
- Outstanding performance during 2013 in developing resilience in anticipation of future incidents threatening life or property, including:
 - Motivating and assisting individuals (including those with special needs), families, organizations, and/or communities to take steps that effectively achieve resilience, for example, developing personal and community preparedness plans and organizing communities so as to promote the rapid recovery of essential services.

- Implementing regular training and exercises that test the resilience of individuals, families, organizations and/or communities.
- Implementing private sector preparedness, for example, developing plans for business continuity and the adoption of cyber security consensus standards and industry best practices to the fullest extent possible.
- Exceeding existing building and other codes in the design and construction of infrastructure, including homes, office buildings, and highway bridges and tunnels.

How to Nominate for the Award

Eligible candidates may be nominated for the Rick Rescorla National Award for Resilience during the nomination period that begins on April 17, 2014 at 12:00 a.m. and closes on **July 17, 2014 at 11:59 p.m (EDT)**. All nominations must be submitted by email to the following DHS email address: rescorlaaward@hq.dhs.gov.





FACT SHEET: Veterans Employment Center

The online Veterans Employment Center is the single federal source for Veterans looking for new career opportunities in the private and public sectors, as well as Service Members transitioning to the civilian workforce, military and Veteran spouses and dependents looking for employment opportunities, GI Bill beneficiaries transitioning from training to the job market and employers looking to connect with high quality applicants. It is the first interagency tool that brings together public and private job opportunities with resume building and other career tools currently offered on a variety of websites together in one place.

Through the online Veterans Employment Center, Veterans, transitioning Service Members and spouses are connected to high quality career choices by matching their identified skills with available public and private job opportunities. The site is built using an open application programming interface (API) to attract private sector innovation.

Veteran Applicant Resources:

- Quick public resume posting with an instant connection to thousands of public and private employers
- Target job search based on specific, high-demand career paths
- Single search for both public and private sector positions
- Military skills translator and resume generator
- Social media integration with popular bookmarking sites for saving job postings

In connection with the First Lady and Dr. Biden's Joining Forces initiative, the Department of Veterans Affairs worked with the Departments of Defense, Labor, and Education, and the Office of Personnel Management to design and develop the site and incorporate features of existing online employment tools at each agency. The result is an upgrade to the existing Veterans Job Bank and an integrated solution connecting Veterans, transitioning Service Members and employers.
