CONGRESSWOMAN SEWELL SUPPORTS PRESIDENT OBAMA'S STRATEGY TO EXPAND MILITARY ACTION AGAINST ISIS

Washington, DC – Tonight, Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell (AL-07) released the following statement in response to President Obama's address to the nation on U.S. strategy against ISIS:

“I fully support the strategy outlined by the President in his speech tonight to immediately expand military action against the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS). I am committed to supporting the Administration's objectives to dismantle, disrupt, and destroy ISIS through a comprehensive and sustained counter-terrorism effort and I would support congressional action for additional funding to address the threat of ISIS.

I believe it is imperative that our international allies join us in waging this campaign to take out ISIS without a conventional U.S. military occupation in the region. I support an American strategy that utilizes our air power and intelligence networks, and supports partner forces on the ground. This strategy is the most appropriate course of action and has proven to be successful in Yemen and Somalia.

We must remain committed to staying the course of eliminating the threat of ISIS and holding these terrorists accountable for the unfathomable brutality they have caused in the region, to American citizens and our allies around the world.”

USDA SEEKS APPLICATIONS FOR GRANTS TO INCREASE ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY AND IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIFE IN RURAL AREAS

Washington, DC - Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack today announced that USDA is seeking applications for grants that will be awarded to organizations to provide critical financial and technical assistance to recipients to develop and strengthen their capacity to carry out housing, community facilities and community and economic development projects.

"Many rural nonprofits often need capital and technical assistance to carry out their missions," Vilsack said. "These grants will provide both of these components through local and regional organizations that are experts at delivering such services."

USDA is making nearly \$6 million available to qualified organizations under the Rural Community Development Initiative (RCDI).

Recipients must be non-profit organizations, low-income rural communities, or federally recognized tribes. Intermediary organizations are required to provide matching funds at least equal to the RCDI grant. The grants do not go directly to business recipients but rather through qualified intermediaries.

The deadline for submitting RCDI applications is November 12, 2014. Applications must be submitted to the USDA Rural Development state office where the applicant's headquarters are located. More information about the program and how to apply is available on page 47427 of the August 13, 2014 Federal Register.

Here is an example of how the RCDI program is helping rural communities. The Western Maine Community Action Program (WMCAP) has received several RCDI grants in recent years to help low-and very-low-income seniors maintain their independence and remain in their homes through the Keeping Seniors Home Program. Started in 2004, this program has served nearly 3,000 low-income senior homeowners in Maine. WMCAP is also working on a regional job creation plan to train energy auditors, private contractors, and other community partners to provide additional support services to Maine's elderly rural citizens.

President Obama's historic investments in rural America have made our rural communities stronger. Under his leadership, these investments in housing, community facilities, businesses and infrastructure have empowered rural America to continue leading the way – strengthening America's economy, small towns and rural communities.

UWA, BLACK BELT COMMISSION OFFER SECOND ANNUAL HOMEGROWN SMALL BUSINESS CONFERENCE

Work from Home...Inside or Out!

TUSCALOOSA, AL—The University of West Alabama Small Business Development Center and the Alabama Black Belt Commission will host the second annual Homegrown Small Business Conference on Friday, September 26, 2014.

The conference, to be held at Shelton State Community College, will include two tracks: the first focuses on farming and agribusiness, and the second targets women and youth who want to start businesses in their home. Donald Mills, chairman of the Black Belt Commission's Small Business Development Committee and director of the University of West Alabama's Small Business Development Center, said, "This will be a great opportunity for a diverse set of entrepreneurs to come together and get the tools they need to succeed in business."

Opening the conference will be Charles Spurlin, owner of The Shirt Shop in downtown Tuscaloosa. He will share lessons he has learned as a successful business owner. "We were so pleased that Mr. Spurlin agreed to be our opening speaker," said Ginger Stewart, project manager for the Small Business Development Committee. "He is an excellent example of how small businesses are the lifeblood of a community. He's

done so much to grow and maintain downtown, and he's extremely adept at marketing and branding.”

For the luncheon keynote address, 11-year-old Moziah Bridges of Memphis will be traveling to Tuscaloosa to inspire the audience. Moziah, CEO of Mo's Bows, has been featured in national media for his successful entrepreneurship. Mo has appeared in magazines including *O: The Oprah Magazine*, *GQ*, *Forbes*, *Vogue*, *Glamour* and *Esquire* and has appeared on the television program *Shark Tank*. “Mo's bow tie business earned over \$30,000 last year,” Stewart said. “He's a real go-getter. Plus, he's adorable! We can't wait for the audience to meet him.”

Breakout sessions will include testimonials from other entrepreneurs, information on resources and loans, and technology. Attendees will also learn how to write a business plan, which Mills said is “the first step to getting any business off the ground.”

What you Will Need to Apply

- ⇒ **DRIVER'S LICENSE** – Proof of current State of Alabama driver's license or State of Alabama issued Non-Driver Identification card at the time of application. *If married, the same information is needed for spouse.*
- ⇒ **SOCIAL SECURITY CARD** – Social Security card(s) or printout(s) from Social Security Administration for each dependent in household *(This includes the Social Security Card for Spouse, if married).*
- ⇒ **AWARD LETTERS** – Letter of Award of Public Assistance (Food Stamps, T.A.N.F. Also, SSI, etc.).
- ⇒ **INCOME** – Proof of income, including spouse, by submitting the last 3 pay stubs or an employer's statement documenting (gross) income for the 6 months prior to the time of application.
- ⇒ **EDUCATION** - G.E.D., High School Diploma, College Transcripts. Please note: Some programs require a copy of a high school transcript instead of a copy of a diploma. If so, this will be requested. Diploma and transcripts must be from an accredited school.
- ⇒ **UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION** – Award letter for unemployment compensation. Applicants must also inform us if they have filed for unemployment, exhausted benefits or been referred by Worker Profiling and Reemployment Services (WPRS).
- ⇒ **DISLOCATED WORKER PROGRAM** – A notice or letter of layoff from your previous employer. *(The letter should be on letterhead from the company with their contact information).*
- ⇒ **HOMELESS** – A letter from the social worker at the shelter. If you are living with someone, you must also provide Proof of Residency from them, along with a completed Applicant Statement form *(This form can be picked up from JCCWD).*
- ⇒ **EMPLOYMENT** – The name, address and telephone number of each place you have applied for employment within the last 30-days.





The online Veterans Employment Center is the single federal source for Veterans looking for new career opportunities in the private and public sectors, as well as Service Members transitioning to the civilian workforce, military and Veteran spouses and dependents looking for employment opportunities, GI Bill beneficiaries transitioning from training to the job market and employers looking to connect with high quality applicants. It is the first interagency tool that brings together public and private job opportunities with resume building and other career tools currently offered on a variety of websites together in one place.

Through the online Veterans Employment Center, Veterans, transitioning Service Members and spouses are connected to high quality career choices by matching their identified skills with available public and private job opportunities. The site is built using an open application programming interface (API) to attract private sector innovation.

- Quick public resume posting with an instant connection to thousands of public and private employers
- Target job search based on specific, high-demand career paths
- Single search for both public and private sector positions
