2015 COMMUNITY CONNECT PROGRAM GRANTS

The Community Connect program serves rural communities where broadband service is least likely to be available, but where it can make a tremendous difference in the quality of life for citizens. The projects funded by these grants will help rural residents tap into the enormous potential of the Internet.

Eligibility

The following entities are eligible for funding:

- Incorporated Organizations;
- Indian Tribes or Tribal Organizations, as defined in 25 U.S.C. 450b(e);
- State or local units of government; or
- Cooperatives, private corporations or limited liability companies organized on a for-profit or not-for-profit basis.

Applications

The application window for Fiscal Year 2015 is now open. Applications must be submitted no later than February 17, 2015 to be considered for an award. Please review the application guide and other information under '[Resources](#)' below for detailed information on how to apply.

Fund Uses

Grant funds may be used to finance the following:

- The construction, acquisition, or leasing of facilities, including spectrum, land or buildings, used to deploy service at the Broadband Grant Speed to all residential and business customers located within the Proposed Funded Service Area (PFSA) and all participating Critical Community Facilities, including funding for up to 10 Computer Access Points to be used in the Community Center. Buildings constructed with grant funds must reside on property owned by the awardee. Leasing costs will only be covered through the advance of funds period included in the award documents;
- The improvement, expansion, construction, or acquisition of a Community Center and provision of Computer Access Points. Grant funds for the Community Center will be limited to 10% of the requested grant amount or \$150,000. If a community center is constructed with grant funds, the center must reside on property owned by the awardee; and
- The cost of providing the necessary bandwidth for service free of charge to the Critical Community Facilities for 2 years.

FY 2014 SAFER Application Assistance Tools

Full Funding Opportunity Announcement

I. Funding Opportunity Description

A. Program Overview

The SAFER Grant Program provides funding directly to fire departments and national, state, local, or tribal organizations representing the interests of volunteer firefighters to assist them in increasing the number of firefighters to help fire departments meet industry minimum standards and attain 24-hour staffing to protect communities from fire and fire related hazards, and to fulfill traditional missions of fire departments.

The SAFER Grant Program is comprised of two categories:

- Hiring of Firefighters
 - o Including subcategories for rehiring, retention, attrition, and new hires
 - o Career, combination, and volunteer fire departments are eligible to apply
- Recruitment and Retention of Volunteer Firefighters
 - o Combination fire departments, volunteer fire departments, and national, state, local, or tribal organizations that represent the interests of volunteer firefighters are eligible to apply

The content of this FOA reflects DHS's implementation of Section 34 of the Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974, as amended by Section 565 of the Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act, 2014 (Pub. L. No. 113-76). Under this authority, the Secretary of Homeland Security has granted waivers for the following requirements for the FY 2014 SAFER Grant Program:

- Cost Share: SAFER Grantees are not required to contribute a cost share towards the cost of hiring firefighters under this program.
- Salary limits per firefighter: SAFER Grant funds may be used to fund the full cost of hiring a firefighter under this program.
- Maintenance of Effort: Applicants are not required to demonstrate that their annual budget for fire-related programs and emergency response has not been reduced below 80% of the average funding level in the three years prior to November 24, 2003.
- Supplanting requirement: Grants may be used for the purpose of retaining firefighters currently employed who are facing imminent layoffs or for the rehiring of laid off firefighters.
- Period of performance: For Hiring of Firefighters category grants, the period of performance has been reduced to two years.

B. Program Priorities

Hiring of Firefighters Category

- First priority: Rehiring laid off firefighters
- Second priority: Retention of firefighters who face imminent layoff or filling positions vacated through attrition but not filled due to economic circumstances

I. Funding Opportunity Description

Program Overview and Priorities

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Grant Programs Directorate is responsible for the implementation and administration of the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) Program. The purpose of the AFG Program is to enhance the safety of the public and firefighters with respect to fire and fire-related hazards by assisting fire prevention programs and supporting firefighter health and safety research and development. The Grant Programs Directorate administers the Fire Prevention and Safety (FP&S) Grant Program as part of the AFG Program.

FP&S Grants are offered to support projects in two activities:

- **Fire Prevention and Safety Activity:** FP&S Activities are designed to reach high-risk target groups and mitigate the incidence of death and injuries caused by fire and fire-related hazards.

Accordingly, the four categories eligible for funding under this activity include the following:

- o General Education/Awareness
- o Code Enforcement/Awareness
- o Fire & Arson Investigation
- o National/State/Regional Programs and Studies

Each category within this activity has specific priorities. For additional details, please see Appendix A., Section II. Eligible Activities and Categories.

- **Research and Development Activity:** R&D Projects are aimed at improving firefighter safety, health, or wellness through research and development that reduces firefighter fatalities and injuries ("Firefighter Safety Research and Development Activity").

Accordingly, the five categories eligible for funding under this activity include the following:

- o Clinical Studies
- o Technology and Product Development
- o Database System Development
- o Dissemination and Implementation Research
- o Preliminary Studies

This FOA provides potential applicants with application requirements and details for processing and evaluating applications for financial assistance for both of these activity areas.

DATES: Proposals are due by February 3, 2015. Proposals must be submitted through www.grants.gov by 11:59 p.m. Eastern Time on February 3, 2015. Please refer to Section IV.B., *Due Date and Submission Instructions*, for further instructions.

SUMMARY: This notice announces the availability of funds and solicits proposals from eligible entities, including nonprofit organizations, to deliver environmental workforce development and job training programs that recruit, train, and place local, unemployed and under-employed residents with the skills needed to secure full-time employment in the environmental field, with a focus on solid and hazardous waste remediation, environmental health and safety, and wastewater-related training. In Fiscal Year 2015 (FY15), EPA anticipates providing some funding preference to applicants who choose to deliver other types of environmental training, beyond brownfields hazardous waste, as referenced in Section I.B and as referenced in Section V.C.

While Environmental Workforce Development and Job Training grants require that Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response (HAZWOPER) training be provided to all individuals being trained, as outlined in Section III.C., *Threshold Eligibility Criteria*, applicants may design their own curricula and choose what types of supplemental environmental training they want to deliver as referenced in Section I.C., *Additional Eligible Uses of Grant Funds*. Additionally, under this competition, applicants also may choose to deliver training in various other environmental media as referenced in Section I.B. EPA encourages applicants to develop their curricula based on local labor market assessments and employers hiring needs, while also delivering comprehensive training that results in graduates securing multiple certifications.

For the purposes of these guidelines, the term “grant” refers to the cooperative agreement that EPA will award to a successful applicant. Please refer to Section II.C. for a description of EPA’s anticipated substantial involvement in the financial assistance agreements awarded under these guidelines.

FUNDING/AWARDS: The total funding available under this competitive opportunity is approximately \$3,400,000, subject to availability of funds, quality of proposals received, and other applicable considerations for FY 2015. EPA anticipates awarding approximately 17 environmental workforce development and job training cooperative agreements at amounts up to \$200,000 each.

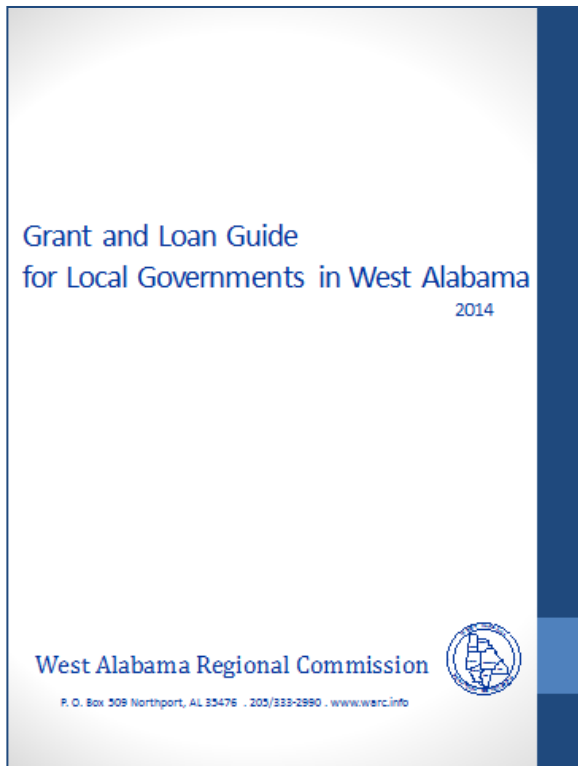

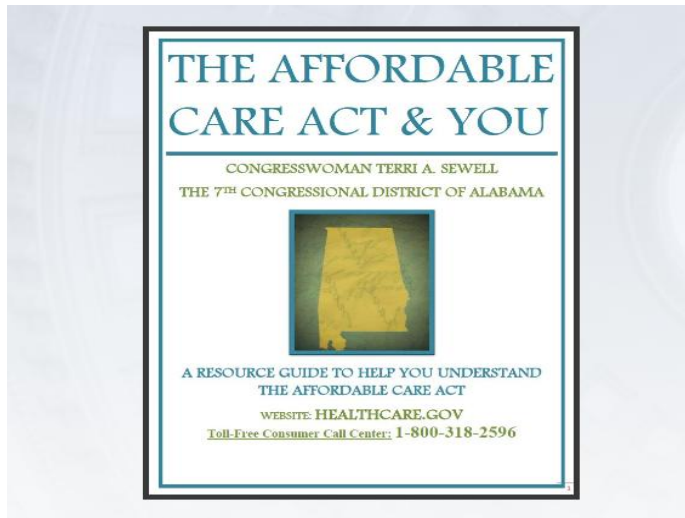

FACT SHEET: Veterans Employment Center

The online Veterans Employment Center is the single federal source for Veterans looking for new career opportunities in the private and public sectors, as well as Service Members transitioning to the civilian workforce, military and Veteran spouses and dependents looking for employment opportunities, GI Bill beneficiaries transitioning from training to the job market and employers looking to connect with high quality applicants. It is the first interagency tool that brings together public and private job opportunities with resume building and other career tools currently offered on a variety of websites together in one place.

Through the online Veterans Employment Center, Veterans, transitioning Service Members and spouses are connected to high quality career choices by matching their identified skills with available public and private job opportunities. The site is built using an open application programming interface (API) to attract private sector innovation.

Veteran Applicant Resources:

- Quick public resume posting with an instant connection to thousands of public and private employers
- Target job search based on specific, high-demand career paths
- Single search for both public and private sector positions
- Military skills translator and resume generator
- Social media integration with popular bookmarking sites for saving job postings

Employer Resources:

- Access targeted feed of qualified resumes from Veteran applicants
- View reverse skills translation (military to civilian skills) for applicants
- Set Veterans hiring goals and track progress
- Connect to resources designed to help recruit and retain talented, Veteran employees

In connection with the First Lady and Dr. Biden's Joining Forces initiative, the Department of Veterans Affairs worked with the Departments of Defense, Labor, and Education, and the Office of Personnel Management to design and develop the site and incorporate features of existing online employment tools at each agency. The result is an upgrade to the existing Veterans Job Bank and an integrated solution connecting Veterans, transitioning Service Members and employers.

Employers, Veterans and transitioning Service Members deserve a single, authoritative source for connecting to each other. Now that the core tools and an integrated search function exist in one single location, each agency is engaged in minimizing duplication and redundancy of current sites and services.
