Scholarships are offered in furtherance of NFBPA's goal of lending support to African American and other minority students interested in leadership roles in public service. Applicants must be current full-time undergraduate and full-time graduate students currently enrolled in a traditional four-year, accredited university or college (preferably an HBCU), have at least 1 full-time academic semester remaining, with a minimum 3.0 GPA (except CIGNA undergrad requires minimum 3.5 GPA). Jersey City based Goya Foods is now accepting applications for their annual Culinary Arts and Food Science Scholarships. Goya Foods has established a scholarship program to assist incoming college freshmen majoring in Culinary Arts or Food Sciences. Renewable scholarships are offered each year for full-time study at an accredited two- or four-year college or university of the student's choice.

Students entering their freshman year in a 4-year college with an undergraduate degree in culinary arts and/or food science are eligible to apply. Students enrolling in a two-year junior or community college must plan to transfer to a four-year institution to earn a bachelor's degree and to receive the total maximum scholarship award. Permanent residents must provide a copy of their current permanent resident card or a current passport stamped I-551. Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) must provide a copy of their DACA approval letter. Must be willing to complete 10 hours per month of community service; this activity to be tracked by Scholarship America. Mercedes-Benz U.S. International Scholarships

Applicants to the Mercedes-Benz U.S. International Scholarship Program must be: high school seniors living in or attending school in Alabama's Jefferson or Tuscaloosa County who plan to enroll in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited two- or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school by the upcoming fall; or high school seniors who are dependent children of full-time Mercedes-Benz U.S. International, Inc. Team Members who plan to enroll in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited two- or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school by the upcoming fall. Children of Management Team members are not eligible.

MBUSI established the program in 2003 to assist Alabama's Jefferson or Tuscaloosa County high school seniors and high school seniors who are dependent children of MBUSI Team Members who plan to attend college or vocational school. Eligibility for individual programs is determined at the sole discretion of the sponsor, and eligible applications are reviewed by Scholarship America's evaluation team. Awards are granted without regard to race, color, creed, religion, sexual orientation, gender, disability, or national origin.

Amount: \$2,000

Deadline: March 16, 2023

House of Blues Music Forward Foundation David E. Ballard Scholarship

Established in the memory of David E. Ballard, with the support of the Living Legacy Foundation, this \$10,000 scholarship supports youth who have experienced homelessness and/or been part of the foster care system pursuing a career in live entertainment.

Applicant must be a full-time undergraduate student with a minimum of 60 credits earned, enrolled at an accredited college or university at the time of award in the fall semester. Applicant must be pursuing a career in live entertainment. Field of study may include but is not limited to: live event operations, production, music engineering, music business management, customer service, hospitality and/or other related fields. Applicants who have experienced homelessness within the last four years, and/or been part of the foster care system any time after the age of sixteen, are eligible to apply. Applicant must be permanently residing in the U.S. Applicant must have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher. This award will be paid directly to a qualified educational institution in two equal payments of \$5000, distributed across at least two academic semesters. February Scholarships

[Gertrude M. Cox Scholarship](#)

The Cox Scholarship, sponsored by the ASA Committee on Women in Statistics and Caucus for Women in Statistics, was established in 1989 to encourage more women to enter statistically oriented professions. Two scholarship recipients are selected each year: one to a woman in or entering the early stages of graduate training (MS or PhD) and one to a woman in a more advanced stage of training. Scholarship recipients receive a certificate and \$1,000. The application is limited to women who are citizens or permanent residents of the United States or Canada and who are admitted to full-time study in a graduate statistics program by July 1 of the award year. Amount: \$1,000

Deadline: February 23, 2023

[The Coolidge Scholarship](#)

The Coolidge Scholarship is an annually awarded, full-ride, presidential scholarship that covers a student's tuition, room, board, and expenses for four years of undergraduate study. The Coolidge may be used by recipients at any accredited college or university in the United States. Anyone of any background, pursuing any academic discipline of study, may apply to this non-partisan, need-blind, program. Students apply for the Coolidge Scholarship during their junior year of high school. Finalists are flown in for a finalist weekend at the Coolidge Historic Site in Plymouth Notch, Vermont where they interview with the Coolidge Scholars Finalist Jury. Current high school seniors are not eligible to apply. Finalists who are not named Coolidge Scholars are eligible to receive a smaller, one-time, college scholarship. Amount: \$120,000

Deadline: February 23, 2023

AMS Scholarship for Underserved Communities

The AMS Scholarship for Underserved Communities will award funding to students who have been traditionally underrepresented in the sciences, especially Hispanic, Native American, and Black/African American students. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or hold permanent resident status. Students who will be entering their freshman year of college in the fall are eligible to apply. Students must plan to pursue careers in the atmospheric or related oceanic and hydrologic sciences. Marine Biology is not eligible. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Students eligible to apply for the AMS Scholarship for Underserved Communities may also apply to the AMS Freshman Scholarship Program but can only accept one scholarship if selected for both. Amount: \$6,000

Deadline: February 24, 2023

BMI peermusic Latin Scholarship

The peermusic Latin Award is an annual competition open to student songwriters and composers of Latin music. A \$5,000 scholarship is presented annually for the best original song or instrumental composition in any Latin genre. In order to be eligible to apply, applicants must: be based in the United States or Puerto Rico; be between the ages of 17 and 24 as of the submission deadline; and must have never had any musical work commercially recorded or distributed. Prior peermusic Latin Scholarship winners (excluding Honorable Mentions) are not eligible to apply. For more information or to apply, please visit the scholarship provider's website.

Amount: \$5,000

DGV Scholarship Program

In order to be considered for the DGV Scholarship, individuals must be an undergraduate student enrolled in an accredited four-year college or a university, or be a high school senior accepted for such enrollment; Must be pursuing, or planning to pursue, a degree in S.T.E.M., finance or business; Must be part of an underrepresented

Scholars accepted into the program will be appointed using the Schedule A(r) authority (5 CFR 213.3202) and may be eligible for noncompetitive conversion to full time employment upon graduation. Successful applicants will receive a temporary appointment to the USDA, not to exceed 4 years. Upon successful completion of the degree requirements and the end of the agreement period, the scholar may be eligible for conversion to permanent appointment in service to USDA without further competition, using the Conversion to Career Conditional Appointment Farm Bill 2018 (5 CFR 213.3102) authority code "ZLM".

All USDA/1890 National Scholars are required to commit to at least one year of service with the USDA for each year of financial assistance provided. (Note: Specific details of this service requirement will be outlined in the service agreement entered into by the selected Scholar, the University at which the Scholar is matriculated, and the USDA Sponsoring Agency.) The USDA/1890 National Scholars Program will provide full tuition, employment, employee benefits, fees, books, and room and board each year for up to 4 years to selected students pursuing a bachelor's degree at eligible universities.

Applicants must: be enrolled in a doctoral program at a university that is a member of the Council for European Studies Academic Consortium; not have completed the majority of doctoral coursework; and not have begun substantial dissertation research in Europe. Barring exceptional circumstances, students who have already received comparable support for pre-dissertation research will not be considered eligible.
