The Sphinx Competition is a national competition offering young Black and Latinx classical string players (violin, viola, cello, or double bass) a chance to compete under the guidance of an internationally renowned panel of judges, and to perform with and receive mentorship from established professional musicians. Application requirements include a video audition (please refer to the audition requirements for the applicable division and instrument), a current biography, a repertoire list, and a high-resolution headshot. Minimum 300dpi (Professional photography not required).

Amount: \$50,000

Deadline: October 23, 2023

The Legacy Lab, a dynamic think tank and strategic consultancy by Team One, is thrilled to announce its annual scholarship program. Geared towards identifying the next generation of legacy makers, the scholarship aims to empower students with a vision for lasting impact. This year, the chosen recipient will be awarded a substantial \$15,000 to support their educational journey and long-term ambitions. Regeneron Science Talent Search Scholarship

Each year, nearly 1,900 students enter the Regeneron STS, submitting original research in critically important scientific fields of study. Unique among high school competitions, the Regeneron STS focuses on identifying, inspiring, and engaging the most promising scientists among the nation's high school seniors. All Regeneron STS entrants must follow the official rules of entry, which outline eligibility requirements, ethics statements, and rules for scientific research.

The Regeneron Science Talent Search proudly identifies future leaders in science, and awards deserving students and their schools with \$3.1 million each year. The first place prize is \$250,000, which is the largest academic prize available to a high school student in the United States. Applicants must be in their final year of high school, completing high school courses required for college applications, must not have graduated from high school before the Regeneron STS application deadline, and must not have entered any previous STS.

Amount: \$250,000

Deadline: November 8, 2023

Propel HBCU Week Student Impact Scholarship

The Propel Center, the global HBCU technology and learning hub is intended to level the playing field and open greater doors of opportunity for its students. In partnership with the HBCU Week Foundation and Southern Company, we are launching a new scholarship program for high-achieving High School Seniors who will be attending HBCUs and are interested in pursuing careers in arts & entertainment, technology, energy, and health.

The Propel + HBCU Week Foundation Student Impact Scholarship is a merit-based scholarship that will be awarded to students who plan on attending an HBCU for the fall of the year following the awarding of the scholarship. This financial assistance is designed to PROPEL high-achieving future HBCU students to and through college. Individuals who are sophomores, juniors, seniors and graduate students are eligible to participate in this program.

Amount: \$50,000

Congressional Black Caucus Foundation Scholarships/Fellowships/Internships

CBCF Fellowship Program

Congressional and NREI Fellows are placed in the Senate, House of Representatives and other select offices to become the next generation of leaders in public service. The program is an intensive 12-month policy training and leadership development program which enables Fellows to receive hands-on public policy training as full-time legislative aides and policy analysts. CBCF Fellowship discipline areas include Health, Cybersecurity, Aerospace/Defense, Diversity & Technology, Finance & Economics, Foreign Policy, Energy, Environment Sustainability, and more. Applicants of all backgrounds will be considered for this opportunity.

Amount: \$60,000-\$70,000

NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship

The NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship is a Congressional Black Caucus Foundation, Inc. (CBCF) program designed to give young, Black professionals the opportunity to work in Congress and with the Foundation to address social justice and racial equity issues that affect the Black community. Distinguished by two six-month rotations, Social Justice Fellows are placed in the U.S. Congress with Congressional Black Caucus members and the CBCF's Center for Policy Analysis and Research (CPAR) for a total of 12 months.

Fellows produce social justice policy research and analysis on topics that include, but not limited to, criminal justice reform, education, community/economic development, health equity, and civil rights. While working in Congressional Black Caucus member offices, Fellows gain invaluable legislative experience as they engage in the development of public policy initiatives, attend briefings, conduct research, write speeches, and develop rapport with key leaders all in the areas of social justice. In the Center for Policy Analysis and Research, Fellows work under the NREI Director and in cooperation with other stakeholders to conduct policy analysis, research, and data collection with the goal to disseminate research findings and relevant information to advance NREI's mission. Fellows during their term may also organize social justice forums and brain trusts, serve as an expert in their field, and produce issue briefs, fact sheets and other publications related to social justice.

Amount: \$70,000

Must be a full-time student, enrolled in at least 12 credit hours.

CME Beef Industry Scholarship

November Fellowships

[Smithsonian Institution Fellowship Program \(SIFP\)](#)

The Smithsonian Institution Fellowship Program offers opportunities for independent research or study related to Smithsonian collections, facilities, and/or research interests of the Institution and its staff. Fellowships are offered to graduate students, predoctoral students, and postdoctoral and senior researchers to conduct independent research and to utilize the resources of the Institution with members of the Smithsonian professional research staff serving as advisors and hosts. These fellowships are offered through the Smithsonian's Office of Academic Appointments and Internships, and are administered under the charter of the Institution, 20 U.S. Code section 41 et seq.

The Smithsonian Institution Fellowship Program offers fellowships for research and study in the following fields and encourages applications of an interdisciplinary nature:

Animal behavior, ecology, and environmental science, including an emphasis on the tropics; Anthropology, including archaeology, cultural anthropology, linguistics, and physical anthropology; Astrophysics and astronomy; Earth sciences and paleobiology; Evolutionary & systematic biology; Folklife; History of science and technology; History of art, especially American, contemporary, African, and Asian art, twentieth-century American crafts, and decorative arts; Materials research; Molecular biology; Social and cultural history of the United States.

Determination of the fellowship category for which to apply should be based on the anticipated academic level at the time the fellowship would begin:

Senior Fellowships – Applicants must have held a Ph.D. or equivalent for at least 7 years. Applicants who have received the Ph.D. or equivalent before June 1, 2017 are eligible to apply for senior fellowships.

Postdoctoral Fellowships – for scholars up to seven years beyond the Ph.D.

Predocctoral Fellowships – for doctoral candidates to conduct dissertation research. Students enrolled in a university as candidates for the Ph.D. or equivalent are eligible for predoctoral fellowships. By the time the appointment begins, the university must approve the undertaking of dissertation research at the Smithsonian Institution and certify that requirements for the doctorate, other than the dissertation, have been met.

Ten-Week Graduate Student Fellowships – for graduate students to conduct independent research usually before having been advanced to candidacy if in a Ph.D. program. When they apply, students must be formally enrolled in a graduate program of study at a degree-granting institution and must have completed at least one full-time semester or its equivalent.

Secondly to that, GEM also provides the Ph.D. Engineering fellowship. Lastly, GEM provides the Ph.D. Science fellowship. Applicants must either be Native American, black or Latino. The complete application annual deadline is at 11:59 pm Eastern Time on the second Friday in November.

The Women's Law & Public Policy Fellowship Program (WLPPFP) at the Georgetown University Law Center offers one year Fellowships for public interest lawyers from the United States who are committed to advancing women's rights throughout their careers.
