[CIA Graduate Program Scholarship](#)

The Graduate Scholarship Program is a financial needs based initiative that offers graduate students an unmatched experience in a diverse and inclusive environment. Graduate students, serving as scholarship recipients with the CIA, attend an accredited college/university on a full-time basis and work during summer breaks at the Agency. Applicants must be U.S. citizens pursuing a graduate degree as a full-time student taking at least 9 credits per semester, demonstrate financial need, achieve a minimum GPA of 3.0, and are available to work for at least one summer at CIA prior to graduation and full-time after graduation.

Amount: \$25,000

Deadline: June 25, 2023

[Phoenix Capital Group Scholarship](#)

The Phoenix Capital Group Scholarship empowers students pursuing a career in the oil and gas industry. The Scholarship program awards a \$15,000 scholarship to a student with high academic credentials and who is enrolled in a degree program, such as petroleum engineering or related major, consistent with a career in oil and gas. To apply for this \$15,000 scholarship, eligible students must submit an essay of 2000 words or less and meet the eligibility requirements.

Applicants must be high school senior that has already been accepted into an accredited college or university or current student enrolled at an accredited college or university full-time. June Scholarships

[American Public Transportation Foundation Scholarship](#)

In furthering our mission to increase and retain the number of individuals choosing the transit field as a career, the APTF will award a minimum of thirty scholarships, ranging from \$5,000 to \$10,000 to college students or transit professionals who are interested in pursuing or advancing in a career in the public transportation industry. Awards cover the academic year and assist with tuition costs or other educational expenses.

Applicants must be college sophomores (30 hours or more satisfactorily completed), juniors, seniors, or those seeking advanced degrees who are enrolled in a fully accredited institution, have and maintain at least a 2.0 GPA in course work that is relevant to the industry or required of a degree program, and demonstrate a strong interest in entering the public transportation industry. All applicants must be sponsored by a member organization of the American Public Transportation Association (APTA). Any member may serve as a sponsor.

Amount: \$10,000

Deadline: June 20, 2023

[Howard L. Aslinger Memorial Scholarship Foundation](#)

The Howard L. Aslinger Memorial Scholarship Foundation is an organization to encourage individuals with disabilities to further their education. The Howard Aslinger Foundation will award scholarships to candidates each year based on applications received. Funds may be used for any type of education from university to vocational training or for special needs education and equipment.

[Angel Wings Thai Scholarship](#)

The initiative behind the Angels Wings Thai Scholarship, United States is to recognize and honor Thai-American students who have demonstrated academic excellence, concern for their Thai community, connection with their heritage, and desire to continue their education. The required factors may be demonstrated through participation in community and high school/college activities.

Eligibility Requirements: Be a Thai-American student; Be a graduating high school senior; Be entering an accredited college or university for the coming academic year; Have an unweighted cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or better; Demonstrate their aspiration through a written essay. Application deadline is June 23rd.

Amount: Varies

Deadline: June 20, 2023

[I/ITSEC Postgraduate Scholarship](#)

In the event that suitable candidates for one level are not identified, funds may be combined to provide two awards at the same level of study. The Postgraduate Scholarships awards are offered at a Masters level in the amount \$5,000 and at a Doctoral level in the amount of \$10,000, with outstanding achievement awards at the \$15,000 level.

The applicant must be a U.S. citizen and successfully complete undergraduate studies by the end of Spring term of the year the scholarship is awarded. The applicant also must be enrolled or accepted for a full-time masters or doctoral program in any of the following disciplines: Engineering (Modeling, Simulation, and/or Training

Related); Operations Research/Systems Analysis/Mathematics; Distance Learning Methodologies; Human Factors (Psychology or Engineering); Instructional Design and Training Methodology; Computer Science and/or Information Sciences.

Amount: \$15,000

Deadline: June 23, 2023

[Jeff Sessions Memorial Scholarship](#)

The Jeff Sessions Memorial Scholarship was created to honor Red River's late CEO and his unwavering commitment to supporting active duty military and veterans with funding to pursue technology careers. Jeff believed technology could be transformational – both in its use and as a career. This scholarship supports veterans and military members as they transition to a career in technology.

This scholarship is open to active duty and retired military transitioning to a career in IT. Supporting a wide variety of educational opportunities, the Sessions Memorial Scholarship can be tailored to the unique needs of the applicant. This includes certification courses, seminars, books, or supplies. As many post-military careers follow non-traditional paths, this scholarship is flexible to support that transition.

Amount: \$5,000

[One Earth Film Festival Young Filmmakers Contest](#)

One Earth Young Filmmakers Contest is open to students from third grade through college. Each film submission is based on one or several of the following topics: water, waste, food, transportation, energy, open space, and ecosystems. All entries must be between 3 and 8 minutes in length. Submissions are open to Elementary, Middle School, High School, Undergraduate and Graduate, as well as post-grad up to age 25.

To enter the contest, entrants must be in one of the following grade level categories at the time of submission. There will be one winner in each of the following seven (7) categories. Occasionally, there will be a tie, allowing for two winners in a category. Contest entries may be submitted by an individual, or by a group of any size (ex: a group of friends, an after-school program, or an entire class). In the case of group submission, one prize will be awarded to the entire group as a whole.

Amount: \$1,000

Deadline: June 25, 2023

Sisters in Public Health Scholarship

Applicants for the scholarships must be public health students in a Masters or Doctorate level program, have completed at least one term, be enrolled as a full-time student, attend school in the United States, identify as female and have a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA. The winners will be notified by the end of July, and the scholarships will be awarded and announced in August.

Besides completing the application, you must also submit: a 150-200 word professional biography (third person point of view); an essay explaining "What is one public health problem that draws your interest, and if you had unlimited funds, how would you fix it?" (300-500 word limit); an essay explaining "Why is this scholarship significant to your success?" (300-500 word limit); an essay explaining "What makes you the strongest candidate for this scholarship?" (300-500 word limit); a resume (PDF only); a transcript; and a recommendation letter.

Amount: \$1,000

Deadline: June 25, 2023

CIA Graduate Program Scholarship

The Graduate Scholarship Program is a financial needs based initiative that offers graduate students an unmatched experience in a diverse and inclusive environment. Graduate students, serving as scholarship recipients with the CIA, attend an accredited college/university on a full-time basis and work during summer breaks at the Agency. The APA has a scholarship called the Tom Cory Scholarship for students pursuing a career in Architecture. Education Requirements: Must be a college junior, senior or graduate student with a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.0 or higher; Must maintain a 3.0 G.P.A. during scholarship period; Must continue education in pursuit of an architectural degree (architect, landscape, or architectural engineering); Must have at least two semesters of school left to complete from date of award; Both Undergraduate and Graduate levels are acceptable; Must be involved in activities related to the their field.

Entry Material Requirements: Scholarship Application; A transcript of two years college through the last grading period prior to the date of application; A typed description of your career plans after graduation; A typed essay (essay 1) explaining why you chose this career; A typed essay (essay 2) of 300 – 500 words on a topic of your choice related to the precast concrete industry; A letter of recommendation from a faculty member of your college or university.

Amount: \$2,000

Deadline: June 30, 2023

[Automotive Hall of Fame Scholarships](#)

The APA has a scholarship called the Tom Cory Scholarship for students pursuing a career in Architecture. Education Requirements: Must be a college junior, senior or graduate student with a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.0 or higher; Must maintain a 3.0 G.P.A. during scholarship period; Must continue education in pursuit of an

architectural degree (architect, landscape, or architectural engineering); Must have at least two semesters of school left to complete from date of award; Both Undergraduate and Graduate levels are acceptable; Must be involved in activities related to the their field.

Entry Material Requirements: Scholarship Application; A transcript of two years college through the last grading period prior to the date of application; A typed description of your career plans after graduation; A typed essay (essay 1) explaining why you chose this career; A typed essay (essay 2) of 300 – 500 words on a topic of your choice related to the precast concrete industry; A letter of recommendation from a faculty member of your college or university.

[Carroll R. Gibson Scholarship](#)

The National Association of Black Narcotic Agents (NABNA) is a non-partisan non-profit organization of Federal, State, and Local law enforcement careerists. Annually, NABNA offers Scholarship Award(s) up to \$5,000.00 per recipient. These scholarships are sponsored by NABNA and are merit based for students pursuing professional fields of study in Criminal Justice and/or public service. Applicants must be currently enrolled as an undergraduate student who will enroll in the coming school year as a Sophomore, Junior, or Senior with any major that would support a future in public service.

The selection is based on the following criteria: A 250-300 Word Essay on, “How has the distribution and use of drugs affected your community?”; Criminal Justice Major; 3.0 minimum grade point average; School and community involvement; Letter of recommendation from a professor in your chosen major; Full-time class standing; Personal/telephone interview. The application and all other information must be received via email no later than June 30th.

Amount: \$5,000

Deadline: June 30, 2023

[David Malcolm Scholarship](#)

The David Malcolm Scholarship is for students who have overcome obstacles to educational achievement – personal, family, demographic or situational – and require help to continue on the path to success. Eligible applicants are high school seniors or college students who have already shown perseverance in pursuing a college degree. They will clearly show how this scholarship will make a difference in realizing success.

Applicants must be a high school senior who has already been accepted into an accredited college or university or a current student enrolled at an accredited college or university full-time. Students must have a minimum GPA of 3.5. In the application form on the scholarship's website, please submit an essay highlighting a current obstacle, explaining how the scholarship award will help overcome it, and how higher education will help you become an inspirational success story. This essay should not exceed 1,000 words and must be submitted prior to the application deadline.

Amount: \$2,500

Deadline: June 30, 2023

[David Womack Memorial LGBT Scholarships](#)

The David Womack Memorial LGBT Scholarships are available to any gay or lesbian undergraduate student who is a resident of Alabama or West Virginia. The scholarship applies to attendance at any institute of higher learning in the United States. An essay and proof of college attendance/acceptance is required. The essay should be no more than five pages and discuss the applicants background, educational history, goals for the future and why the applicant believes they should receive the scholarship.

While the IanThom Foundation makes grants throughout the year, the vast majority of our funds are distributed at the start of each calendar year. Many referrals come from friends and associates, and we encourage suggestions from our friends and applications from any qualified organizations. A number of arts grants are direct designated by the donors in memory of Thom and so do not go through the grant process. The IanThom Foundation is committed to the support and enhancement of GLBT life and rights, the arts and progressive causes through strategic donations to select national organizations and smaller, community organizations where small grants can make a big difference.

Amount: \$1,000

Deadline: June 30, 2023

[DFLA Education Fund Scholarship Essay Contest](#)

In order to apply for the DFLA Education Fund Scholarship Essay Contest, applicants must submit a 500-word to 800-word essay based on the year's prompt. Each essay is scored based on originality, creativity, the strength of argument, acknowledgment of alternative perspectives, and proper use of grammar and spelling. Party affiliation, gender, and personal politics are immaterial. The contest will use "blind" scoring. The winner will be invited to read his/her essay at the DFLA Education Fund National Conference. Must be 17 to 26 years of age, a

full-time student, and a U.S. citizen or DACA recipient. The DFLA Education Fund is a registered 501(c)3 nonprofit that does both educational and advocacy work. There is no required reading for this essay, nor are any citations required in the essay. However, reviewing the recommended resources is highly encouraged.

Amount: \$2,500

Deadline: June 30, 2023

[Epilepsy Reach Education Scholarship Program](#)

The Epilepsy Reach Education Scholarship is awarded to three students who suffer from epilepsy and/or a seizure disorder to help with related expenses for trade school, college, or graduate programs. To be eligible, you must be a legal resident of the United States; Reside in or attending an educational institution in an under-served community in the Southeast US region; Be/have been diagnosed with epilepsy by a certified physician or be an immediate family member living with a person diagnosed with epilepsy (parent, spouse, or child).

Applicants must be seeking an associate's, undergraduate, or graduate degree from an accredited US based college or university; A student who demonstrates academic and personal achievement, possess a strong record of participation in activities outside of school, and serves as a positive role model for others; Graduating from high school in the year the scholarship is awarded or have already graduated from high school seeking to further your education or a current college student. Must have been accepted or enrolled in a US based college or university for the fall semester of the scholarship and must not be a previous recipient of the Epilepsy Reach Foundation Scholarship.

Amount: \$1,000

Deadline: June 30, 2023

[Hajja Razia Sharif Sheikh Scholarship](#)

The Islamic Society of North America is pleased to have been selected by Dr. Hamid Sheikh to host a scholarship endowment in Islamic Studies and/ or Journalism in the name of his mother Hajja Razia Sharif Sheikh. As a native of Pakistan, Hajja Razia was schooled traditionally at home, and held a strong belief in the value of formal education, encouraging each of her children to pursue college studies. Applicants must be Muslim students who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents enrolled in an accredited U.S. college or university studying Islamic Studies or Journalism. A minimum 3.5 GPA is also required.

Every year, the Islamic Society of North America (ISNA) awards several need-based scholarships to students for their college studies. The awards are based on academic performance, community development work, and other similar factors. The online application process is run through Award Spring, and the ISNA Scholarships Committee makes the final selections. Applicants must be actively engaged in the community development work.

Amount: \$1,500

Deadline: June 30, 2023

[HSVMA Compassionate Care Veterinary Student Scholarship](#)

The HSVMA Compassionate Care Veterinary Student Scholarship will be awarded to students who are currently in their first, second and third years at an AVMA-accredited veterinary school in the US, Canada, the Caribbean or the UK. The scholarships will be awarded to veterinary students who (1) demonstrate an interest in animal welfare, animal rights, or animal protection issues and (2) represent a commitment to equitable access and inclusion in veterinary medicine via service or lived experience.

Scholarship submission requirements include: GPA and academic history; two letters of recommendation (one letter must be written by a faculty member or clinician employed at the veterinary school you are attending); financial information (expected debt burden); and a statement of intent which demonstrates interest in animal welfare and service or experience with equitable access to care for underserved communities. HSVMA's mission is to use its expertise and resources to advance animal welfare via leadership, advocacy, education and service in the veterinary field.

Amount: \$10,000

Deadline: June 30, 2023

[IAEE Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Scholarship](#)

Required Information/Documents: Family or student characterized with demonstrated financial need; Completed scholarship application (online form); High school-issued official transcript (upload); Acceptance letter in a full-time undergraduate at an accredited college, university, junior or technical college; Essay submission (online form); Two letters of recommendation from high school teachers or high school counselor (upload); Resume (upload)

Must include: List your extra-curricular activities, both in and out of school, and the years of participation; List positions of leadership you have held, both in and out of school (e.g. Community Groups, Service Organizations,

Philanthropy); List awards and honors you have received in both academic and extra-curricular activities; List work experience (paid or voluntary) with the job title, the average number of hours worked per week, and the dates of employment.

Amount: \$2,500

Deadline: June 30, 2023

[Kelly Somey Digital Marketing Scholarship](#)

Are you a high school senior interested in a marketing career? As part of our commitment to supporting the next generation of marketing creatives, we're once again offering college-bound students a chance to receive our annual Kelly Somey Digital Marketing Scholarship. This student must be interested in pursuing a digital marketing career and must be passionate about creative work.

[Live Poets Society of New Jersey – National High School Poetry Contest](#)

All U.S. high school students are eligible to enter the poetry contest. That eligibility is continuous until June 30 of their senior year. Poems must be 20 lines or less (title and spaces between stanzas do not count), unpublished, the sole work of the entrant, and not be entered in any other concurrent contest. Only poems written in the English language can be judged. Foreign phrases are acceptable only with a translation provided. Only one poem per poet may be entered during any 90-day span. Estimated deadlines for each quarterly publication vary.

Amount: \$500

The Media Fellows program is the Foundation's essay-based scholarship program, striving to provide financial assistance to undergraduate college students with interests at the intersection of advertising and public policy. Applicants must be undergraduate students currently enrolled and attending a college or university in the United States.

Successful Media Fellows Scholarship submissions include an essay that includes the student's personal financial need statement as well as a description of their academic achievements and career aspirations, a letter of

recommendation, and a professional resume. Rising freshmen are ineligible for Media Fellows Scholarships. Media Fellowships are one-time only award. We seek to support students demonstrating a combination of merit and financial need whose academic interests are at the intersection of advertising and public policy.

July Fellowships

The M. Hildred Blewett Fellowship is offered to female students to enable women to return to physics research careers after having had to interrupt those careers. The fellowship consists of a one-year award of up to \$45,000. Allowed expenses include dependent care (limited to 50% of the award), salary, travel, equipment, and tuition

and fees. Overhead charges by the institution are not allowed. To be eligible, applicants must: have completed work toward a Ph.D.; provide written proof from a U.S. or Canadian institution that the applicant will have institutional affiliation during the tenure of the grant; and be a U.S. or Canadian citizen or legal resident, or resident alien eligible to work in the United States or Canada.

In selecting fellowship recipients, the following criteria will be considered: qualifications of the applicant; the status of career before their break; steps the applicant has taken to return to physics research; the relationship of the applicant to the research community; the relationship of the project and award to future plans; scholarly significance of the project; and the quality and feasibility of the project design and timeline. In addition to completing the application, applicants must also arrange for 1-3 recommendation letters (one of which may be from a designated mentor, must be uploaded through the application portal by person coordinating recommendation letter), and a letter of institutional support during the tenure of the grant.
