The Daniel B. Goldberg Scholarship recognizes outstanding performances by graduate program students preparing for a career in state and local government finance. Applicants must be full-time graduate students with a course of study that has a relationship to state/local government finance, be U.S. citizens or permanent residents, and provide a letter of recommendation. The Goldberg-Miller Public Finance Scholarship is funded by the Girard Miller Foundation.

GFOA provides several scholarship opportunities for students interested in pursuing a career in state/provincial or local government finance. Encouraging and supporting educational opportunities for future government finance officers are integral to our mission of promoting best practices in local government. GFOA currently offers numerous types of scholarships. Criteria and dollar amounts will vary by scholarship. Previous winners are ineligible.

Ellie Wiesel Prize In Ethics Essay Contest

Through international dialogue and youth-centric initiatives, the Elie Wiesel Foundation aims to foster acceptance, understanding, and equality, rooted in the memory of the Holocaust. Students must display and describe engagement with ethical questions and dilemmas in a thoughtful essay of between 3,000 and 4,000 words, applicants are encouraged to raise pertinent questions, highlight specific issues, and identify ethical quandaries. The narrative can take various forms, such as biographical, historical, literary, philosophical, psychological, sociological, or theological analysis.

Incoming and current undergraduates enrolled in accredited four-year colleges or universities in the United States during the fall semester are encouraged to apply.

Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship

CBCF Fellowship Program

Congressional and NREI Fellows are placed in the Senate, House of Representatives and other select offices to become the next generation of leaders in public service. The program is an intensive 12-month policy training and leadership development program which enables Fellows to receive hands-on public policy training as full-time legislative aides and policy analysts. CBCF Fellowship discipline areas include Health, Cybersecurity, Aerospace/Defense, Diversity & Technology, Finance & Economics, Foreign Policy, Energy, Environment Sustainability, and more. Applicants of all backgrounds will be considered for this opportunity.

Amount: \$60,000-\$70,000

NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship

The NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship is a Congressional Black Caucus Foundation, Inc. (CBCF) program designed to give young, Black professionals the opportunity to work in Congress and with the Foundation to address social justice and racial equity issues that affect the Black community. Distinguished by two six-month rotations, Social Justice Fellows are placed in the U.S. Congress with Congressional Black Caucus members and the CBCF's Center for Policy Analysis and Research (CPAR) for a total of 12 months.

Fellows produce social justice policy research and analysis on topics that include, but not limited to, criminal justice reform, education, community/economic development, health equity, and civil rights. While working in Congressional Black Caucus member offices, Fellows gain invaluable legislative experience as they engage in the development of public policy initiatives, attend briefings, conduct research, write speeches, and develop rapport with key leaders all in the areas of social justice. In the Center for Policy Analysis and Research, Fellows work under the NREI Director and in cooperation with other stakeholders to conduct policy analysis, research, and data collection with the goal to disseminate research findings and relevant information to advance NREI's mission. Fellows during their term may also organize social justice forums and brain trusts, serve as an expert in their field, and produce issue briefs, fact sheets and other publications related to social justice.

Amount: \$70,000

December Scholarships

AWWA Dr. Philip C. Singer Scholarship

This scholarship aims to support students committed to conducting research that offers actionable and timely solutions to address contemporary challenges within the water industry. To be eligible for the Dr. Philip C. Singer Scholarship, applicants must meet the following criteria: Be enrolled as a graduate student at an accredited college or university, be pursuing a comprehensive plan of study that includes a focus on water quality/treatment and public health, and demonstrate a commitment to research with a specific emphasis on water quality/treatment.

This scholarship is a testament to the commitment to nurturing the next generation of leaders and innovators in the water industry. Dr. Philip C. Singer's legacy is honored by empowering graduate students to contribute meaningful research outcomes.

Amount: \$3,000

Deadline: December 21, 2023

AWWA Larson Aquatic Research Support Scholarships

These scholarships are established to celebrate the memory of Dr. Thurston E. Larson and provide support and encouragement to outstanding graduate students pursuing careers in science or engineering. Two scholarships are awarded annually. To be considered for the Thurston E. Larson Memorial Scholarships, applicants must: Be currently enrolled in a graduate program, be pursuing a career in science or engineering, and demonstrate outstanding academic achievement and potential.

Master's Level Student: \$5,000 funding. Doctoral Level Student: \$7,000 funding.

Amount: \$5,000-\$7,000

NSTA Angela Award

The award recognizes one female student in grades 5-8 who has shown excellence of involvement and/or has strong connections to science; evidence of sustained accomplishments or progress/interest in science; and evidence that the student's interest in science has impacted others. This award consists of a \$500 US EE Savings Bond or Canada Savings Bond purchased for the equivalent issue price.

Amount: \$500

Deadline: December 21, 2023

AREMA Undergraduate and Graduate Scholarships

General Criteria for all scholarship applicants include having an interest in railway engineering, maintaining a minimum GPA of 2.5, and being available for interview by the AREMA Scholarship Committee. Enrolled students must have completed at least one quarter or semester in an accredited four or five year engineering or engineering technology undergraduate/graduate degree program.

The application form applies to all Scholarships offered by AREMA. By completion of this form, the Scholarship Review Committee will determine which Scholarship(s) the candidate qualifies for. Listed amounts are the minimum offered scholarship. Final amounts may vary. Successful applicants will be informed of awards in March. Only one scholarship is awarded per qualified applicant.

Dwellsy Scholarship

Open to all undergraduate and graduate students currently enrolled at a university in the United States, this scholarship was created to help five distinguished students cover their expenses so they can focus on their education. Future Attorneys of America Merit Scholarship

Answering Legal's Future Attorneys of America Scholarship is dedicated in choosing one law student of academic excellence every year and awarding them with the FAAS merit scholarship. To be eligible, applicants must currently be enrolled at an accredited law school, maintain a minimum GPA of 3.5, and submit an unofficial copy of their transcript.

Minorities In Government Finance Scholarship

Applicants may be a full-time or part-time minority graduate student or upper level undergraduate student studying public administration, (governmental) accounting, finance, political science, economics, or business administration (with specific focus on government or nonprofit management). A letter of recommendation from someone who can speak to your commitment to the public sector will be required.

GFOA provides several scholarship opportunities for students interested in pursuing a career in state/provincial or local government finance. Encouraging and supporting educational opportunities for future government finance officers are integral to our mission of promoting best practices in local government. Students interested in future scholarship opportunities should keep in mind the following: they must be a citizen or permanent resident of the US or Canada.

Apprentice Ecologist Scholarship

The goals of the Apprentice Ecologist Initiative are to elevate youth into leadership roles by engaging them in environmental cleanup and conservation projects, empower young people to rebuild the environmental and social well-being of our communities and improve local living conditions for both citizens and wildlife through education, activism, and action. Applicants must conduct their own environmental stewardship project: Take a few digital photos of your project in action. Write an essay about your project and what it meant to you and register at the scholarship provider's website and upload your favorite project photo along with your essay.

Climate Adaptation Scientists of Tomorrow Undergraduate Research Experience Program

The global climate is changing rapidly, already impacting both human and natural systems. Over the next few decades, changes in temperature, precipitation, and climatic variability are expected to drive even more change. To face future challenges, we need leaders—representative of our nation's diversity—with expertise in climate adaptation, experience in multi-disciplinary collaboration, exceptional communication skills, and dedication to actionable science. Applicants must: be full time students at a U.S. accredited academic institution, rising sophomore or junior, in good academic standing (GPA 3.0 or higher).

Amount: Varies

Deadline: December 31, 2023

Dr. Nicholas Vacc Scholarship

Applicants must currently be board certified by holding the National Certified Counselor (NCC) credential. If the applicant is not currently board certified, they must document all of the following: A full state license as a professional counselor; A passing score on the National Counselor Examination for Licensure and Certification (NCE) or the National Clinical Mental Health Counseling Examination (NCMHCE); A commitment to apply for the NCC credential and to complete the application within the shortest possible timeframe after notification of the MFP award. Applicants must be currently enrolled full time for the fall semester and be in good standing in a Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP)-accredited, doctoral-level counseling program.

All U.S. high school students are eligible to enter the poetry contest. That eligibility is continuous until June 30 of their senior year. Poems must be 20 lines or less (title and spaces between stanzas do not count), unpublished, the sole work of the entrant, and not be entered in any other concurrent contest. Only poems written in the English language can be judged. Foreign phrases are acceptable only with a translation provided. Only one poem per poet may be entered during any 90-day span.

Maodong Xu Science & Technology Scholarship

The Maodong Xu Science & Technology Scholarship supports students seeking a career in technology with a minor focus in business. To apply for this \$1,000 scholarship, eligible students must submit a 1000-word essay and meet the following eligibility requirements. Applicants must be a high school senior accepted into an accredited college or university or a current student enrolled full-time at an accredited college or university Active or declared focus of study must be in technology science, and the applicant must understand and intend to work with Web 3.0 technology in the future. Intention to work with Web 3.0 technology in the future. Minimum GPA of 3.5.

Mary P. Oenslager Scholastic Achievement Awards (SAA)

Each year, the Mary P. Oenslager Scholastic Achievement awards are presented to Learning Ally members who are completing undergraduate or graduate degrees, and who are blind or visually impaired, in recognition of academic achievement, outstanding leadership, and service to others. Learning Ally awards top winners \$6,000 each and special honors winners \$3,000 each.

Amount: \$6,000

Deadline: December 31, 2023

Minority Serving Institute Scholarship Program

The NROTC has a limited number of scholarships available for students to attend MSI schools, which encompass Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU), High Hispanic Enrollment (HHE) schools, and other Minority Serving Institutions (MSI). Must be a Navy Option applicant (Marine Corps and Nurse Corps Option applicants are not eligible), and must successfully receive nomination from MSI to be considered for the MSISR scholarship. Must have no criminal or civil offenses, between 17-23, and a US citizen.

Amount: Varies

NBCC Foundation Military Scholarship

These scholarships provide financial support to students who are currently enrolled in a CACREP-accredited, masters level counseling program; are active duty, have served in the military within the past five years or are a military spouse; and who commit to serving military personnel for a minimum of two years. Up to five scholarships in the amount of \$8,000 are available.

Applicants must be enrolled full time in a CACREP-accredited counseling master's program and be former or current active-duty U.S. military service members or spouses of a military service member whose service was within the past five years.
