SCHOLARSHIP ALERT!

Samuel Huntington Public Service Award

The Samuel Huntington Public Service Award provides \$30,000 stipends to graduating college seniors to pursue public service anywhere in the world. The Award allows recipients to engage in a meaningful public service activity for one year before proceeding on to graduate school or a career. Awards will be based on the quality of the proposal, academic record, and other personal achievements. Finalists will be personally interviewed prior to selection of the award recipient(s).

Amount: \$30,000

Deadline: January 12, 2024

Smith Scholarship Foundation

The Smith Scholarship Foundation, established by Avondale Mills heiress Mignon Comer Smith, invests in the college education of economically disadvantaged students across the state of Alabama. Applicants must be Alabama residents who are graduating high school seniors, have a minimum 2.3 GPA, and have taken or plan to take the SAT or ACT. Applicants must submit an essay on their plans or goals of accomplishment themselves. (The applicant must write the essay. A teacher may review it, but the applicant must be the author.) This scholarship has many benefits, including financial assistance up to \$20,000 annually.

Amount: \$20,000

Deadline: January 13, 2024

ACHE Student Grant Program

The Alabama Student Grant Program is available only to students at an eligible independent Alabama college or university. This is not a need based program. Grant amounts vary from year-to-year based on the availability of funds, but cannot exceed \$3,000 per academic year. Applications are available from the financial aid office at the institution you plan to attend. Applicants must be residents of Alabama.

The Alabama Student Grant Program is a state student assistance program established to provide financial assistance to residents of the State of Alabama for undergraduate, non-sectarian education at independent, non-profit, post-secondary institutions of higher learning located within the State of Alabama. Applicants must be a citizen of the United States or in the process of becoming a citizen. Applicants must not be enrolled and not intend to enroll in a course of study leading to an undergraduate degree in theology, divinity, or other religious vocation.

Amount: \$3,000

Deadline: January 15, 2024

Dolly Parton Songwriters Award

The Dolly Parton Songwriters Award is an annual, nationwide competition open to aspiring songwriters. The revised program offers \$20,000 for up to two of the best original song entries in any of the following genres: Americana, blues, bluegrass, contemporary Christian, country, folk, and roots.

No rights to the submitted work may have been assigned to a major music publisher or to a major record label and applicant must not be a prior BMI Foundation Nashville Songwriting Scholarship winner (excluding Honorable Mentions). Note: Nashville Songwriting Scholarship entrants who are also applying to the John Lennon Scholarships must submit different songs for each contest. Dual applicants may NOT submit the same original work to both competitions.

The Coolidge Scholarship

The Coolidge Scholarship is a prestigious, full-ride, presidential scholarship for four years of undergraduate study at any accredited U.S. college or university, open to students of all backgrounds and academic disciplines. Covers tuition, room, board, and expenses for four years of undergraduate study. Open to junior year high school students or equivalent if home-schooled. Applicants must be citizens or legal permanent residents of the United States. Finalists invited to an interview weekend in Vermont, with expenses covered for them and one parent.

Amount: \$120,000

Deadline: January 18, 2024

HBCU Week x FOSSI STEM Scholarship

Applicant must have declared a major (and maintain that major) in a discipline including, but not limited to: If you aspire to make a positive impact through science, engineering, or math and plan to attend an HBCU, the FOSSI scholarship is your opportunity. Check the list of preferred STEM majors, including Chemical Engineering, Computer Science, Environmental Science, and more. Must be a U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident.

Amount: \$40,000

CBCF Fellowship Program

Congressional and NREI Fellows are placed in the Senate, House of Representatives and other select offices to become the next generation of leaders in public service. The program is an intensive 12-month policy training and leadership development program which enables Fellows to receive hands-on public policy training as full-time legislative aides and policy analysts. CBCF Fellowship discipline areas include Health, Cybersecurity, Aerospace/Defense, Diversity & Technology, Finance & Economics, Foreign Policy, Energy, Environment Sustainability, and more. Applicants of all backgrounds will be considered for this opportunity.

Amount: \$60,000-\$70,000

NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship

The NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship is a Congressional Black Caucus Foundation, Inc. (CBCF) program designed to give young, Black professionals the opportunity to work in Congress and with the Foundation to address social justice and racial equity issues that affect the Black community. Distinguished by two six-month rotations, Social Justice Fellows are placed in the U.S. Congress with Congressional Black Caucus members and the CBCF's Center for Policy Analysis and Research (CPAR) for a total of 12 months.

Fellows produce social justice policy research and analysis on topics that include, but not limited to, criminal justice reform, education, community/economic development, health equity, and civil rights. While working in Congressional Black Caucus member offices, Fellows gain invaluable legislative experience as they engage in the development of public policy initiatives, attend briefings, conduct research, write speeches, and develop rapport with key leaders all in the areas of social justice. In the Center for Policy Analysis and Research, Fellows work under the NREI Director and in cooperation with other stakeholders to conduct policy analysis, research, and data collection with the goal to disseminate research findings and relevant information to advance NREI's mission. Fellows during their term may also organize social justice forums and brain trusts, serve as an expert in their field, and produce issue briefs, fact sheets and other publications related to social justice.

QuestBridge College Prep Scholars Program

The College Prep Scholars Program equips high-achieving high school juniors from low-income backgrounds with the knowledge, confidence, and resources to apply to top colleges. Applicants must be academically-outstanding high school juniors from families earning less than \$65,000/year for a family of four. College Prep Scholars may receive a full scholarship to a college summer program at top schools, money towards school equipment, campus visits or test school fees, an invitation to a national college admissions conference, as well as guidance and coaching on applying for college. ESA Youth Scholarship Program

We appreciate the contribution that police, firefighters, paramedics, and EMTs offer to our communities. To show our appreciation, the program was developed to provide college scholarships to their deserving children. High school seniors who have a commitment to excellence and are inspired by the work their first responder parent(s) do in our communities, are invited to apply.

Students whose parents serve in a participating state must apply in that state. If state is not listed below with a participating association, students should apply directly to ESA. Winners from each state and the first-round ESA

NLHA Education Fund Scholarship

The NLHA Education Fund was established as a 501(c)(3) organization to raise funds for the purpose of awarding education grants and scholarships to low income individuals residing in federally assisted rental housing owned,

managed, or administered by members of the National Leased Housing Association. Applicants must be residents of privately-owned federally assisted low income housing properties, or recipients of Section 8 voucher assistance that demonstrate both need and merit. Awards are available for undergraduate and graduate studies, trade schools and returning students.

The NLHA Education Fund will offer four types of scholarships, one in recognition of one of the nation's largest affordable rental housing providers and three are in memory of three dedicated housing professionals and active NLHA members. The deadline for application submission is Friday, March 24th at 5:00 pm ET. All applications must be submitted electronically through the link provided. Essay and Art Contest on Civil and Human Rights

Dalit Solidarity Forum in the USA, Hindus for Human Rights, and Indian American Muslim Council are pleased to present the second annual Essay and Art Contest on Civil and Human Rights. The theme for this year's contest is: Intersections Between Caste Discrimination and Anti-Black Racism. We invite South Asian American students* in grades 6-12 to reflect on the intersections between caste discrimination and anti-Black racism.

Across South Asia and the diaspora, persons from oppressed-caste communities such as Dalits continue to face various forms of discrimination, oppression, and societal segregation. In India, caste discrimination is illegal, and affirmative action policies have enabled social, political and economic mobility for some who come from Dalit families. Yet, caste oppression persists and persons belonging to Dalit communities remain socially, economically, and politically marginalized.

We welcome submissions from students in grades 6-12 who identify as belonging to the South Asian diaspora, defined broadly. Students from all religious backgrounds are welcome. We invite students whose identities intersect in meaningful ways with Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, the Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan, or Sri Lanka, and the United States. This includes members of the diaspora whose families hail from the Caribbean, Fiji, Singapore or Malaysia, or countries in Africa, for example, as well as students who identify as bi-racial or transcultural.

Essay must be 700 words minimum; 1,000 words maximum and in Microsoft Word (.docx) document; double-spaced, 12 pt. Times New Roman font. No personal identification information may be in the body of the essay. Citations, if any, must be placed in the end, and will not be part of the word count.

For those submitting visual art, you must submit a high-resolution photograph of your artwork in 8 1/2 x 11 inch or 11 x 17 inch format. For more information or to apply, please visit the scholarship provider's website.

Marguerite Young Endowment Fund

The Marguerite Young Endowment Fund was established to provide assistance for students pursuing theology. Applicants must attend a Protestant seminary as a master of Divinity candidate, preparing for full-time ministry and/or be a seminary intern working at a Protestant Church as a requirement for the degree program. Applicants must have completed the credit equivalent of at least one full year of enrollment in the degree program and have a minimum 2.0 GPA. United Methodist GBHEM General Scholarships

GBHEM Scholarships administers scholarship programs with one general application. Criteria for each scholarship program varies. For general scholarships, applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents and be an active member of the United Methodist Church. Scholarship programs are divided into three categories: general scholarships, racial-ethnic scholarships and ministry-as-a-career scholarships.

Funding for our scholarships is made possible through the generosity of our fellow United Methodists and through decades of sound financial stewardship by our agency. Financial support for all GBHEM and scholarships comes from multiple sources. Every year, we award an average of \$5.5 million to help students in the United States and abroad pursue their dreams through higher education.

1,000 Dreams Scholarship

All women enrolled in a U.S. based institution – high school, college, university, graduate school, etc. – are able to apply for the Greater Kansas City Community Foundation 1,000 Dreams Scholarship, regardless of citizenship. You must show proof of current enrollment in a United States based school. The students eligible for assistance shall: demonstrate financial need; include two letters of recommendation; and include an essay explaining how the grant would be used. Funds must be used the semester after they are awarded and cannot be deferred.

The purpose of the 1000 Dreams Scholarship is to provide one-time educational assistance for high school aged girls or currently enrolled college-aged women in the United States. This can include assistance for needs including but not exclusive to: educational conferences, instructional programs related to creative or artistic pursuits, graduate exam application fees, or textbooks. Needs that are ongoing (e.g., utility bills, food costs) or related to medical care are not covered by this fund.

AATCC Foundation Scholarships

students enrolled in their final year of a healthcare management graduate program. Each scholarship is worth

\$5,000. Between the McGaw and Dent scholarships, ACHE awards up to 15 scholarships each year.

ACHE Foster G. McGaw Graduate Student Scholarship

You may apply for a Foster G. McGaw Graduate Student Scholarship if you meet all of the following criteria: you are a student enrolled full-time in a healthcare management graduate program - MHA, MPH, MBA in Healthcare Administration or similar; you are entering your final year (fall/spring) of full-time study; you expect

to graduate between the upcoming September and August of next year; you can demonstrate financial need; you are a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident (or a Canadian citizen); and you are not a previous recipient of

this scholarship.

ACHE is a professional society of more than 48,000 healthcare executives. Known for its prestigious credentialing and educational programs and high-caliber publications, its vision is to be the preeminent professional society for healthcare executives dedicated to improving health. This scholarship is offered to provide financial aid to

AFDO Scholarship Awards

In 1981, AFDO established a scholarship fund with the excess funds from the 75th Anniversary of the Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act celebration. The "George M. Burditt Scholarship" and the "Betsy B. Woodward Scholarship", both in the amount of \$2,500 each will be awarded annually to a worthy recipient who is in their third year of

college. A third scholarship, the "Denise C. Rooney Scholarship," worth \$2,500 was created in June 2008 and

will also be awarded annually to a worthy recipient who is in their third year of college.

The recipients should have demonstrated a desire to serve in a career of research, regulatory work, quality control, or teaching in an area related to some aspect of foods, drugs or consumer product safety; should have demonstrated

leadership capabilities; be in their third year of undergraduate college; and must have attained at least a 3.0 grade

point average during the first two years of undergraduate study.

American Wine Society Educational Foundation Scholarships

The American Wine Society Educational Foundation (AWSEF) annually awards academic scholarships to

support students pursuing an academic program in enology, viticulture, and concerning business or health aspects of wine. Applicants must be full-time graduate students who have completed at least one semester in a graduate

program leading to a M.S., Ph.D., or equivalent in enology, viticulture, business or health aspects of wine, as

stated above, and who expresses their intent to work in one of these areas upon completion of their graduate

degree. Ph.D. candidates with a M.S. from another graduate program are eligible. Applicants must also be U.S.

ASDSO Senior Undergraduate Scholarship (Dam Engineering)

Successful recipients must be U.S. citizens or lawful permanent residents and enrolled full-time at the senior level in an accredited civil engineering program or in a related field as determined by ASDSO. Students must also

demonstrate an interest in pursuing a career in hydraulics, hydrology or geotechnical disciplines, or in another

discipline related to the design, construction and operation of dams.

Applicants must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 for the first three years of college and be recommended by their academic advisor. Selection will generally be based on academic performance, financial

Eligible applicants must work at a US academic institution or eligible non-profit, be US citizens or permanent residents, and not have a faculty appointment (e.g., instructor, research assistant professor).
