Soroptimist's Live Your Dream Award

The Live Your Dream Awards present a transformative opportunity for women who aspire to overcome financial barriers and pursue their educational and career dreams. With three levels of cash awards, the program aims to support women who are the primary financial providers for themselves and their dependents. Detail the financial support role, financial need, educational enrollment, motivation, residency, and confirm the absence of a graduate degree and Soroptimist affiliation in your application.

Amount: \$16,000

Deadline: November 15, 2023

Frito-Lay Community Builders Scholarship

The Frito-Lay Community Builders Scholarship is an initiative aimed at recognizing and empowering young leaders committed to making a positive impact on their communities. Frito-Lay, a brand synonymous with quality and community engagement, is set to award four students \$25,000 each to support their higher education goals. In addition to standard application requirements, students are asked to respond to a prompt highlighting how they contribute to their communities and the impact on their higher education path.

Modeling the Future Challenge

Congressional Black Caucus Foundation Scholarships/Fellowships/Internships

CBCF Fellowship Program

Congressional and NREI Fellows are placed in the Senate, House of Representatives and other select offices to become the next generation of leaders in public service. The program is an intensive 12-month policy training and leadership development program which enables Fellows to receive hands-on public policy training as full-time legislative aides and policy analysts. CBCF Fellowship discipline areas include Health, Cybersecurity, Aerospace/Defense, Diversity & Technology, Finance & Economics, Foreign Policy, Energy, Environment Sustainability, and more. Applicants of all backgrounds will be considered for this opportunity.

Amount: \$60,000-\$70,000

NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship

The NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship is a Congressional Black Caucus Foundation, Inc. (CBCF) program designed to give young, Black professionals the opportunity to work in Congress and with the Foundation to address social justice and racial equity issues that affect the Black community. Distinguished by two six-month rotations, Social Justice Fellows are placed in the U.S. Congress with Congressional Black Caucus members and the CBCF's Center for Policy Analysis and Research (CPAR) for a total of 12 months.

Fellows produce social justice policy research and analysis on topics that include, but not limited to, criminal justice reform, education, community/economic development, health equity, and civil rights. While working in Congressional Black Caucus member offices, Fellows gain invaluable legislative experience as they engage in the development of public policy initiatives, attend briefings, conduct research, write speeches, and develop rapport with key leaders all in the areas of social justice. In the Center for Policy Analysis and Research, Fellows work under the NREI Director and in cooperation with other stakeholders to conduct policy analysis, research, and data collection with the goal to disseminate research findings and relevant information to advance NREI's mission. Fellows during their term may also organize social justice forums and brain trusts, serve as an expert in their field, and produce issue briefs, fact sheets and other publications related to social justice.

Amount: \$70,000

November Scholarships

10X Digital Marketing Scholarships

HaPI Measurement Scholarship

WTS Leadership Legacy Scholarship for Graduates

The Leadership Legacy Fund has been established to honor the past, present, and future leaders of WTS by awarding an annual scholarship to female graduate students pursuing a career in transportation. Eligible candidates are pursuing graduate degrees in transportation or a related field (such as transportation engineering, planning, finance, communications, or logistics) and demonstrate leadership skills and an active commitment to community service. Applicants must have a 3.0 GPA.

Amount: \$5,000

Deadline: November 21, 2023

Muir Way Scholarship

Any two or four-year undergraduate student who has non-profit or volunteering experience and is pursuing environmental science or a major related to environmental conservation may apply for this scholarship, but those pursuing cartography or GIS are preferred.

Amount: \$1,000

The Weber Shandwick Scholarship

The Weber Shandwick Scholarship is currently accepting applications from high school seniors and anyone currently enrolled in an undergraduate college or university. The Weber Shandwick Scholarship is not merit based, so you don't need to submit any grades or test scores. All you have to do is write one 400-600 word essay.

Amount: \$1,000

BABOR Breaking Boundaries Esthetics Scholarship

The BABOR Breaking Boundaries Esthetics Scholarship is available exclusively to students who identify as a person of color. This scholarship is open to students currently enrolled or newly accepted into an esthetics program leading to licensure in the U.S. or Canada. The application requires the completion of an online application and a short video in which applicants answer proposed questions.

Amount: \$3,125

Deadline: November 30, 2023

Colonel Kathleen Swacina Scholarship

The Col. Kathleen Swacina Scholarship Fund awards one female college student a \$1,500 scholarship to be applied toward the student's ongoing higher-level academic education at an accredited four-year school. To be eligible applicants must: be a member of the U.S. armed forces or enrolled in a ROTC program; an honorably discharged veteran of the U.S. armed forces; or a direct descendant of an AFCEA member or an honorably discharged member of the armed forces. Applicants must be enrolled as a full-time college/university student at an accredited institution attending schools in or residing in the states of Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina, Florida and Alabama including community colleges. Undergraduates students must be at the sophomore or junior level, and graduate students must have completed at least two courses but are not graduating in the current academic year; and must major in a STEM-related area of study in support of the mission of AFCEA. Students must maintain an overall 2.8 GPA.

Amount: \$1,500

Deadline: November 30, 2023

Dr. Juan Andrade Jr. Scholarship for Young Hispanic Leaders

Applicants must be enrolled or accepted for enrollment as full-time undergraduate students, in an accredited four-year or two-year institution in the U.S. or U.S. territories, and demonstrate a verifiable need for financial support. At least one parent must be of Hispanic ancestry. Non-U.S. citizens are eligible to apply (DACA or Undocumented). Applicants must be full-time undergraduate students. This includes high school seniors, college freshmen, sophomores, and juniors up to age 25.

Amount: \$1,000 for 4-year institutions or \$500 for 2-year institutions

Deadline: November 30, 2023

Emery Reddy Legal Studies Scholarship

To be eligible for the Emery Reddy Legal Studies Scholarship, applicants must be a US citizen or a permanent resident and be currently enrolled in or recently accepted to an accredited US law school (legal studies scholarship) or accredited US college or university (undergraduate scholarship). Applicants must submit an original and compelling essay of 400-600 words answering a selected essay prompt. Winner(s) will be required to provide proof of residency and enrollment or acceptance.

Amount: \$2,000 to one law school student, \$1,000 to three undergraduate students

Deadline: November 30, 2023

Answering Legal Law Scholarship

Applicants of this scholarship must meet the following criteria: be currently enrolled at an accredited law school (this means you can be accepted to a law school as an incoming 1L; alongside other documents, provide proof of matriculation); have a minimum 3.5 GPA; and submit an unofficial copy of their transcript (if you are a rising 1L, please provide your undergraduate transcript). In order to receive Answering Legal's FAAS merit scholarship, students must meet the scholarship's minimum criteria, and submit a completed application along with a 500-1000 essay. Hope Scholarship

Hope Scholarship applicants must be a citizen, national or legal permanent resident of the United States and must currently be a 2022 high school graduate and a college freshman at either a 4-year or 2-year institution. To qualify applicants must have a minimum unweighted cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or have earned a GED and must demonstrate financial need and qualify based on income restrictions and limitations. Alabama applicants must be a resident of Montgomery County. A 500-word essay must be written in response to specific essay prompts.

Amount: \$2,500

Deadline: November 30, 2022

Horst Rechelbacher Sustainable Beginnings- Cosmetology/Barbering Scholarship

The Horst Rechelbacher Sustainable Beginnings- Cosmetology/Barbering Scholarship is open to new or currently enrolled students in a cosmetology/barbering program that leads to licensure at an accredited school in the U.S. The applicant must be eighteen (18) years of age or older by the start date of the program at the accredited school or institution. Applicants must complete an online application and submit a 3-minute video answering three provided questions.

Amount: \$3,500

Deadline: November 30, 2023

Horst Rechelbacher Sustainable Beginnings- Esthetics Scholarship

The Horst Rechelbacher Sustainable Beginnings- Cosmetology/Barbering Scholarship is open to new or currently enrolled students in a esthetics program that leads to licensure at an accredited school in the U.S. The applicant must be eighteen (18) years of age or older by the start date of the program at the accredited school or institution. Applicants must complete an online application and submit a 3-minute video answering three provided questions.

Amount: \$2,500

OHM Advisors Diversity Scholarship

Peter K. New Award

The Peter K. New Prize is open to any graduate or undergraduate student registered at a college or university during the calendar year immediately preceding the presentation of the award. Students who have previously earned a doctorate are not eligible for the competition. To be considered, students should submit a previously unpublished manuscript based on original field research in the social sciences. The competition is limited to manuscripts by a single author. The prize-winning author must present the paper in person at the Society for Applied Anthropology annual meeting immediately following the competition. November Fellowships

AAUW American Dissertation Fellowship
