SCHOLARSHIP ALERT!

Samuel Huntington Public Service Award

The Samuel Huntington Public Service Award provides \$30,000 stipends to graduating college seniors to pursue public service anywhere in the world. The Award allows recipients to engage in a meaningful public service activity for one year before proceeding on to graduate school or a career. Awards will be based on the quality of the proposal, academic record, and other personal achievements. Finalists will be personally interviewed prior to selection of the award recipient(s).

Amount: \$30,000

Deadline: January 12, 2024

Smith Scholarship Foundation

The Smith Scholarship Foundation, established by Avondale Mills heiress Mignon Comer Smith, invests in the college education of economically disadvantaged students across the state of Alabama. Applicants must be Alabama residents who are graduating high school seniors, have a minimum 2.3 GPA, and have taken or plan to take the SAT or ACT. Applicants must submit an essay on their plans or goals of accomplishment themselves. (The applicant must write the essay. A teacher may review it, but the applicant must be the author.) This scholarship has many benefits, including financial assistance up to \$20,000 annually.

Amount: \$20,000

Deadline: January 13, 2024

ACHE Student Grant Program

The Alabama Student Grant Program is available only to students at an eligible independent Alabama college or university. This is not a need based program. Grant amounts vary from year-to-year based on the availability of funds, but cannot exceed \$3,000 per academic year. Applications are available from the financial aid office at the institution you plan to attend. Applicants must be residents of Alabama.

The Alabama Student Grant Program is a state student assistance program established to provide financial assistance to residents of the State of Alabama for undergraduate, non-sectarian education at independent, non-profit, post-secondary institutions of higher learning located within the State of Alabama. Applicants must be a citizen of the United States or in the process of becoming a citizen. Applicants must not be enrolled and not intend to enroll in a course of study leading to an undergraduate degree in theology, divinity, or other religious vocation.

Amount: \$3,000

Deadline: January 15, 2024

[Dolly Parton Songwriters Award](#)

The Dolly Parton Songwriters Award is an annual, nationwide competition open to aspiring songwriters. The revised program offers \$20,000 for up to two of the best original song entries in any of the following genres: Americana, blues, bluegrass, contemporary Christian, country, folk, and roots.

No rights to the submitted work may have been assigned to a major music publisher or to a major record label and applicant must not be a prior BMI Foundation Nashville Songwriting Scholarship winner (excluding Honorable Mentions). Note: Nashville Songwriting Scholarship entrants who are also applying to the John Lennon Scholarships must submit different songs for each contest. Dual applicants may NOT submit the same original work to both competitions.

Amount: \$20,000

Deadline: January 15, 2024

[The Coolidge Scholarship](#)

The Coolidge Scholarship is a prestigious, full-ride, presidential scholarship for four years of undergraduate study at any accredited U.S. college or university, open to students of all backgrounds and academic disciplines. Covers tuition, room, board, and expenses for four years of undergraduate study. Open to junior year high school students or equivalent if home-schooled. Applicants must be citizens or legal permanent residents of the United States. Finalists invited to an interview weekend in Vermont, with expenses covered for them and one parent.

Amount: \$120,000

Deadline: January 18, 2024

[HBCU Week x FOSSI STEM Scholarship](#)

Applicant must have declared a major (and maintain that major) in a discipline including, but not limited to: If you aspire to make a positive impact through science, engineering, or math and plan to attend an HBCU, the FOSSI scholarship is your opportunity. Check the list of preferred STEM majors, including Chemical Engineering, Computer Science, Environmental Science, and more. Must be a U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident.

Amount: \$40,000

Deadline: January 31, 2024

CBCF Fellowship Program

Congressional and NREI Fellows are placed in the Senate, House of Representatives and other select offices to become the next generation of leaders in public service. The program is an intensive 12-month policy training and leadership development program which enables Fellows to receive hands-on public policy training as full-time legislative aides and policy analysts. CBCF Fellowship discipline areas include Health, Cybersecurity, Aerospace/Defense, Diversity & Technology, Finance & Economics, Foreign Policy, Energy, Environment Sustainability, and more. Applicants of all backgrounds will be considered for this opportunity.

Amount: \$60,000-\$70,000

NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship

The NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship is a Congressional Black Caucus Foundation, Inc. (CBCF) program designed to give young, Black professionals the opportunity to work in Congress and with the Foundation to address social justice and racial equity issues that affect the Black community. Distinguished by two six-month rotations, Social Justice Fellows are placed in the U.S. Congress with Congressional Black Caucus members and the CBCF's Center for Policy Analysis and Research (CPAR) for a total of 12 months.

Fellows produce social justice policy research and analysis on topics that include, but not limited to, criminal justice reform, education, community/economic development, health equity, and civil rights. While working in Congressional Black Caucus member offices, Fellows gain invaluable legislative experience as they engage in the development of public policy initiatives, attend briefings, conduct research, write speeches, and develop rapport with key leaders all in the areas of social justice. In the Center for Policy Analysis and Research, Fellows work under the NREI Director and in cooperation with other stakeholders to conduct policy analysis, research, and data collection with the goal to disseminate research findings and relevant information to advance NREI's mission. Fellows during their term may also organize social justice forums and brain trusts, serve as an expert in their field, and produce issue briefs, fact sheets and other publications related to social justice.

Amount: \$70,000

[“Make A Ripple, Change the World” Kindness Action Competition](#)

Does your kindness project make ripples in the community? Does it encourage others to gain knowledge, change their mindset, and have more kind behaviors? How is it continuing kindness once you have completed the project? We challenge you to be a force for good. SevenDays has seven themes: Love, Discover, Others, Connect, You, Go, and Onward.

We are looking for high school seniors who will take one or more of these seven themes and apply them to a lasting project that will start a ripple to change the world. Essays will be evaluated on the strength of the impact the project makes on the community, the creativity and/or originality of the project, and the longevity of the project. Writing skills will be taken into account as they help convey the message effectively.

Amount: \$1,000

Deadline: January 12, 2024

[Air Force ROTC Scholarships](#)

There are a variety of Air Force ROTC Scholarships for high school students. Applicants must either be a United States citizen or obtain U.S. citizenship by the last day of the first term of their freshman year (for four-year offers) or the first term of sophomore year (for three-year offers). Applicants must pass a Department of Defense Medical Examination Review Board (DODMERB) medical exam. Applicants must have a minimum SAT composite of 1240 or ACT composite of 26 and a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher.

Amount: Varies

E J Josey Scholarship Award Committee of the Black Caucus

Freedom of information is under attack in our libraries. Please choose a local, state, or national issue affecting libraries and write a 3-5-page essay designing an awareness program or outreach activity for your library to include your objective and desired outcomes. Each year, African American students enrolled in or accepted by ALA-accredited programs are awarded The E. J. Josey Scholarships which are unrestricted grants of \$2,000.

Persons Wishing to Apply Must: Be an African American Citizen of the United States or Canada; Be enrolled or accepted by ALA-accredited graduate program leading to a degree in library and information science at the time of application and must include a cover letter providing the applicant's name, address, phone number, graduate program, name of the school, and anticipated date of graduation. Essay submissions must be in plain text, Microsoft Word format to be mailed electronically as an attachment. Only essays submitted electronically will be considered. Please include E.J. Josey in the subject line of your electronic submission. The essay must be typed and double-spaced.

Amount: \$2,000

Deadline: January 12, 2024

John F. Kennedy Profile in Courage Essay Contest

The John F. Kennedy Library Foundation invites U.S. high school students to describe and analyze an act of political courage by a U.S. elected official who served during or after 1917, the year John F. Kennedy was born. Essays must be between 700 and 1,000 words in length, excluding citations and bibliography. Essays must be the original work of the student. Essays must include a minimum of five sources to support the essay subject.

Amount: \$10,000

Deadline: January 12, 2024

Teen Changemakers Essay Contest

For this year's topic, create a virtual mental health campaign or program, including details on how it would impact others and how you would implement it by working with school staff. Essays should be between 500-1000 words (but will not be penalized for surpassing the word count if the content is deemed an essential to the student's message), in 12 point Times New Roman font. Citations not included in word count. Applicants must be a current high school student in 9th to 12th grade and must provide your high school teacher or counselor's information for verification.

Amount: \$1,000

Deadline: January 12, 2024

Smith Scholarship Foundation

The Lyons Aviation Foundation Scholarship

We seek to encourage the pursuit of aviation for young men and women through our scholarship program. The Lyons Aviation Foundation's hope is to inspire, assist, and to provide opportunity. Opportunity is not divided equally, even if luck and talent and hard work might be. The goal of this scholarship is to help give opportunity to those that might not otherwise have the means to pursue aviation as a career path. The recipient must be able to obtain and provide proof of a FAA Third Class medical certificate prior to the start of any training. Applicants must be aged 16-24, and they must be a US citizen or permanent resident.

Amount: \$9,000

Dr. Wynetta A. Frazier “Sister to Sister” Scholarship

The Wynetta A. Frazier "Sister-to-Sister" Scholarship was created to provide financial assistance to mature African American women in their pursuit of post-secondary education. An applicant must be a returning student, whose education was interrupted by family responsibilities or other personal demands and is now ready to complete college, or one who is entering college for the first time because of these factors. Applicants must meet at least one of the previous-mentioned criteria.

Amount: \$1,000

Deadline: January 14, 2024

ACHE Student Grant Program

The Alabama Student Grant Program is available only to students at an eligible independent Alabama college or university. This is not a need based program. Grant amounts vary from year-to-year based on the availability of funds, but cannot exceed \$3,000 per academic year. Applications are available from the financial aid office at the institution you plan to attend. Applicants must be residents of Alabama.

BMI Composer Awards

To be eligible, applicants must: be in residence in the United States or its territories, or citizens of any country in the Western Hemisphere; be currently studying music, either in an educational institution or privately; not be a previous winner of the BMI Composer Award more than two times (Honorable Mention excluded); and be under the age of 28 years old by the application deadline. The submitted work must not have won any other award or recognition, and must not be under contract with a publisher or record label. Applicants may not submit the same musical work to more than one BMI Foundation awards program.

This is an annual competition open to young composers engaged in the study of classical music. Our oldest awards program in any genre, the competition has a prestigious history of discovering and encouraging many of today's most prominent and talented young composers. Awards are determined annually for vocal, instrumental, and/or electronic compositions submitted by students of classical music.

Amount: \$20,000

Deadline: January 15, 2024

BMI Future Jazz Master Scholarship

The BMI Future Jazz Master Award is an annual competition open to rising jazz stars enrolled at colleges and universities nationwide. A panel of NEA Jazz Master judges selects the winner based on evidence of talent and potential as a jazz performer and composer, and the scholarship is presented at BMI's annual celebration of NEA Jazz Masters Fellows. Past judges include jazz legends Ahmad Jamal, Jack DeJohnette, Jimmy Heath, and Ron Carter. In order to be eligible for the competition, all applicants must be between the ages of 17 and 24 as of the submission deadline.

Amount: Varies

Deadline: January 15, 2024

BMI peermusic Latin Scholarship

The peermusic Latin Award is an annual competition open to student songwriters and composers of Latin music. One of the few distinctions of its kind, the award was established in 2003 through the generosity and vision of peermusic CEO, Ralph Peer II. For over a decade, the program has nurtured promising musicians who have gone on to distinguish themselves in the fields of television, film, recorded music, and concert performance. A \$5,000 scholarship is presented annually for the best original song or instrumental composition in any Latin genre. In order to be eligible to apply, applicants must: be based in the United States or Puerto Rico; be between the ages of 17 and 24; and must have never had any musical work commercially recorded or distributed.

Amount: \$5,000

Deadline: January 15, 2024

CAP Cadet Flight Scholarships

To be eligible for the CAP Cadet Flight Scholarships, applicants must: be at least 16; and have a Third Class Medical Certificate and valid student pilot certificate (however, there's no requirement to have these at the time that you apply. If selected, applicants will have to send a copy of both certificates in order to claim their scholarship). These scholarships can be used for ground school, flight training at a local FBO(FAA part 61 or 141), training on CAP aircraft with a CAP instructor or at a CAP flight academy. Dollar amounts for the scholarships will vary.

Amount: \$5,000

Deadline: January 15, 2024

Civil Air Patrol Academic Scholarships

Civil Air Patrol Academic Scholarships are monetary awards used to support members pursuing their undergraduate or graduate education. In order to apply, you must be a high school senior, high school graduate or hold a GED and have been accepted to a college/school. Applicants must submit: at least one but not more than three letters of recommendation written by someone who is familiar with the cadets' accomplishments in CAP; and a resume, not longer than 2 pages, detailing any academic, community or CAP activities not addressed on previous tabs of the application.

Amount: \$4,000

Deadline: January 15, 2024

Civil Air Patrol William E. Hanna Scholarship

Due to the generosity of Lt Col Hanna's family, CAP is able to offer this flight scholarship to help cadets attain their Private Pilot's Certificate. This scholarship provides up to \$5,000 which can be used for local flight training at a FBO (FAA part 61 or 141) or training on CAP aircraft with a CAP flight instructor. Eligible applicants must be a current cadet that has completed a CAP Powered Solo Flight Academy at the Wing, Region, or National-level and earned the solo rating.

Amount: \$5,000

Deadline: January 15, 2024

Dolly Parton Songwriters Award

The Dolly Parton Songwriters Award is an annual, nationwide competition open to aspiring songwriters. The revised program offers \$20,000 for up to two of the best original song entries in any of the following genres: Americana, blues, bluegrass, contemporary Christian, country, folk, and roots. Judges for previous competitions have included GRAMMY-winning artist Kacey Musgraves, hit songwriter Rodney Clawson, and Nashville music industry veteran Mark Brown among others.

The fellowship provides support and guidance to some of the nation's best scientific graduate students and these graduates now work in DOE laboratories, private industry, and educational institutions. This is open only to full-time students and legal US residents. Dollar amounts for this scholarship will vary.

[The Kress Foundation Conservation Fellowship](#)

The purpose of the Kress Conservation Fellowship program is to provide a wide range of post-graduate fellowship opportunities that will help develop the skills of emerging conservators. Initial training, typically at one of a handful of institutions in North America, provides basic qualifications that must be supplemented with an extended period of specialized concentration on paintings, objects, textiles, antiquities, ethnic materials, photographs, prints and drawings, books and manuscripts, furniture, etc. Within a supervised environment, the young conservator develops the specific skills, the hands-on experience, and the confidence on which to base a future career.

Six \$37,000 Fellowships are expected to be awarded each year for post-graduate internships in advanced conservation at a museum or conservation facility. Applications must be made by the museum or conservation facility at which the fellowship will be based. Prior to beginning the fellowship, fellows should have completed a masters-level degree in conservation.

The program seeks to support a set of fellowships that offer:

A variety of specialty areas (paintings, paper, objects, etc.). Opportunities for graduates from a variety of graduate programs in the U.S. and Canada. Opportunities to work in a variety of institutions, from large municipal museums to university museums and other conservation facilities, as well as sites outside the U.S. Preference may be given to institutions that have not recently hosted Kress Fellows.

Boren Fellowship

David L. Boren is the principal author of the legislation that created the National Security Education Program and the Boren Awards, the scholarships and fellowships that bear his name. In arguing in the U.S. Senate for passage of NSEP, Boren expressed his view that the U.S. needed a large increase in experts in the languages and cultures of nations which were underrepresented in the number of U.S. students studying there. With changes in the world, Boren felt that the U.S. would work more and more through partnerships with other countries whose needs and perspectives needed to be more fully understood.

Boren Fellowships, an initiative of the National Security Education Program, provide unique funding opportunities for U.S. graduate students to study less commonly taught languages in world regions critical to U.S. interests, and underrepresented in study abroad, including Africa, Asia, Central and Eastern Europe, Eurasia, Latin America and the Middle East. In exchange for funding, Boren Awards recipients commit to working in the federal government for at least one year after graduation.

NLM Associate Fellowship Program

The National Library of Medicine Associate Fellowship is: a one-year residency program for early and second career librarians within five years of graduation interested in advancing equitable and innovative futures for biomedical libraries; a program combining curriculum and project work; and a virtual fellowship hosted by the National Library of Medicine at the National Institutes of Health. Eligible applicants must have a Master's degree in an ALA-accredited library/information science program, earned by August of the year of appointment or within 2 years, and must be Canadian or American citizens.
