To qualify, applicants must: be a graduating high school senior planning to enroll in the upcoming fall as a full-time, first-year student; have a 2.8 GPA; be a citizen, legal permanent resident or national of the United States; and display an interest in pursuing a major in Engineering (such as Chemical, Civil, Computer, Construction, Environmental, Industrial, Materials, Marine, Petroleum, Software), Computer Science (such as Cloud Engineering & Infrastructure, Cybersecurity, Data Engineering and Data Science & Analytics, Management of Information Systems) or other relevant fields of study.

Besides completing the application, applicants must also: submit a resume displaying, leadership, volunteer opportunities, extracurricular activities and any additional activities/projects groups or clubs related to their interest in the intended majors; submit an essay that demonstrates their interest in their intended majors, leadership experience and interest in the company and/or industry; and have demonstrated financial and unmet need as measured by the student's college or university.

Amount: \$15,000

Deadline: August 14, 2023

Congressional Black Caucus Foundation Scholarships/Fellowships/Internships

CBCF Fellowship Program

Congressional and NREI Fellows are placed in the Senate, House of Representatives and other select offices to become the next generation of leaders in public service. The program is an intensive 12-month policy training and leadership development program which enables Fellows to receive hands-on public policy training as full-time legislative aides and policy analysts. CBCF Fellowship discipline areas include Health, Cybersecurity, Aerospace/Defense, Diversity & Technology, Finance & Economics, Foreign Policy, Energy, Environment Sustainability, and more. Applicants of all backgrounds will be considered for this opportunity.

Amount: \$60,000-\$70,000

NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship

The NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship is a Congressional Black Caucus Foundation, Inc. (CBCF) program designed to give young, Black professionals the opportunity to work in Congress and with the Foundation to address social justice and racial equity issues that affect the Black community. Distinguished by two six-month rotations, Social Justice Fellows are placed in the U.S. Congress with Congressional Black Caucus members and the CBCF's Center for Policy Analysis and Research (CPAR) for a total of 12 months.

Fellows produce social justice policy research and analysis on topics that include, but not limited to, criminal justice reform, education, community/economic development, health equity, and civil rights. While working in Congressional Black Caucus member offices, Fellows gain invaluable legislative experience as they engage in the development of public policy initiatives, attend briefings, conduct research, write speeches, and develop rapport with key leaders all in the areas of social justice. In the Center for Policy Analysis and Research, Fellows work under the NREI Director and in cooperation with other stakeholders to conduct policy analysis, research, and data collection with the goal to disseminate research findings and relevant information to advance NREI's mission. Fellows during their term may also organize social justice forums and brain trusts, serve as an expert in their field, and produce issue briefs, fact sheets and other publications related to social justice.

Amount: \$70,000

July Scholarships

[AAMA Student Essay Competition](#)

You are eligible to enter if you are enrolled in and have completed at least one quarter or semester at a college-level medical assisting program accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) or Accrediting Bureau of Health Education Schools (ABHES). Applicants must submit an essay in response to the prompt: "What are three personal characteristics that will assist you in becoming the best medical assistant you can be, and why is it important to obtain a medical assisting credential?"

Essays must be between 400 and 500 words and emailed as a Microsoft Word attachment. The AAMA Awards Committee will judge essay entries based on writing, content, and overall effectiveness. Want to see an example? You can read last year's winning essay by visiting our website.

Amount: \$1,000

Deadline: July 15, 2023

[BOWEN Web Design Scholarship](#)

The BOWEN Web Design Scholarship is awarded semi-annually to full or part-time students, with a declared major related to web design or development. Applicants should demonstrate a web design that is visually appealing, has a high-quality user experience, navigation, and good content structure throughout.

The winner(s) will also receive a design critique from our top designers at BOWEN. Applicant must be a student at an accredited school or be accepted to begin school at an accredited school within 6 months of application. Applicant must be attending school in the U.S. Applicants can win the contest up to 2 times only. All funds will be dispersed to the scholarship recipient within 30 days of being announced as the winner.

Amount: \$1,500

Inspiring More Minds offers education-based scholarships for individuals living with sickle cell disease. We know that “education” can take many forms. We define it as an activity that furthers one’s knowledgebase to improve their quality of life and advance their ability to create a sustainable livelihood. This could take the form of a workshop, course, experiential-learning, or degree program. Award amounts range and are determined by demonstrated need, availability of funds, number of applicants, and the discretion of the Board of Directors.

To be eligible for the Cyntra D. Scott Scholarship, applicants must: be 26 and over; use this scholarship between the upcoming August and July of the following year; submit a formal application that will include a detailed explanation of how the applicant will use the money to further their education; and write an impact statement after a designated period following receipt of the scholarship. Applicants must have their physician prepare a “physician letter” verifying that they have SCD or check off “On file” if IMM is already aware of their Sickle Cell status.

Amount: Varies

Deadline: July 15, 2023

[Excelen-SIA Academic Scholarship](#)

Today, Latinos are the fastest growing group in the country; however, this group also has the country's highest high school drop-out rate. Latinos not only have to face the normal hurdles of school education, but many face the challenges of being first-generation students, having to assist at home with financial burdens early on in life, learn a new language, or suffer a lack of educational resources.

Applicants must be recently graduated high school seniors beginning freshman year in an accredited 4 year college or a college freshman entering sophomore standing attending a 4-year college or university in the United State or its territories. Applicants must also have a minimum 2.5 on 4.0 scale if a College Freshman, or a 3.7 on a 4.0 (90 Average) if a high school senior. Note that a sealed transcript will be required from your academic institution.

Amount: \$1,500

Deadline: July 15, 2023

[Helen Veress-Mitchell Scholarship](#)

Investing in people living with HIV is crucial and a primary mission of Capital City AIDS Fund (CCAF). CCAF aspires to award scholarships to all qualified applicants, and we encourage all qualified students to apply. However, priority will be given to those students who: are enrolled in a minimum of nine hours of class work; are attending traditional institutions of higher learning; and have a GPA of 2.5 or higher. Apart from the application, applicants must also submit: transcripts from the last two academic years; proof of enrollment; two recommendation letters (from a medical provider and/or educator); and documentation of their HIV+ status. Inquire with CCAF for specific award amounts.

[Hopi Tribe Grants and Scholarships Program](#)

The goals of the Hopi Tribe Grants and Scholarships Program are to provide quality services to the Hopi People by enhancing a full range of educational opportunities, maintain efforts to increase the number of employable Hopi professionals, and maintain retention services which will enable students to complete programs. Individual criteria may vary by scholarship, and some scholarships may require additional materials, such as letters of recommendation.

Amount: Varies

Deadline: July 15, 2023

[Khyentse Foundation Buddhist Studies Scholarships](#)

Buddhist Studies Scholarships are intended to support students who are in or plan to enroll in a program in Buddhist studies. Khyentse Foundation scholarships are awarded for one-year terms. Scholarship recipients may apply each year for a continuing support to fund longer-term studies. Applications are open for teachers, students, practitioners, scholars, and translators, from all traditions, schools, and sects of Buddhism. Deadlines will vary.

Khyentse Foundation Individual Practice Grants are awarded for one-year terms. They are intended to support those who wish to practice in a Buddhist tradition. Applications are reviewed by an international selection committee appointed by Dzongsar Khyentse Rinpoche.

Khyentse Foundation offers many opportunities for individuals and organizations to apply for grants and scholarships to support their dharma studies, practice, and activities. In the nonsectarian spirit of the Khyentse lineage, we accept applications from Buddhist teachers, students, scholars, translators, practitioners, and retreatants, following all traditions, and from all parts of the world. Each application is reviewed by an international committee appointed by Dzongsar Khyentse Rinpoche.

[Mary Bowman Arts in Activism Award](#)

Student and non-student artists are welcome to apply for this award. These \$5,000 awards are intended to support two young "artists" (27 years of age or younger) each year who exemplify Mary's passion for the arts as the vehicle for their own HIV/AIDS community activism and expression. Recipients of the Mary Bowman Arts in Activism Award use their art and activism to raise greater awareness about bigotry, stigma and social justice, particularly around the issue of HIV/AIDS.

To be eligible for the Paradise Scholarship, applicants must: be 25 and under; use this scholarship between the upcoming August and July of the following year; submit a formal application that will include a detailed explanation of how the applicant will use the money to further their education; and write an impact statement after a designated period following receipt of the scholarship. Applicants must have their physician prepare a “physician letter” verifying that they have SCD or check off “On file” if IMM is already aware of their Sickle Cell status.

Amount: \$1,500

[Pedro Zamora Young Leaders Scholarship](#)

The Pedro Zamora Young Leaders Scholarship seeks to support the academic efforts of young activists working in their communities. The scholarship is open to all current high school seniors and first-year college students, sophomores and juniors (ages 17 and younger), including those who are finishing their Bachelor’s degree. Our scholars’ academic, extracurricular, or career pursuits are consistent with the goals of the scholarship program, demonstrate an active commitment to community justice work, and take on public service and leadership roles.

Applicants must be high school juniors or seniors. This is open to both domestic and international students. Submissions must be the student's original work and not published elsewhere.

Towards the beginning of August, a grand prize scholarship winner and two runners up will be announced, and (pending author approval) their stories will be featured on the Learncurious website and blog.

Emily's Light CF Foundation scholarships are provided to two or three deserving students each year. ForEverglades Scholarships provide up to \$30,000 per year for stipends, tuition fees, travel, and other research-related expenses.

The ForEverglades scholarships are open to full-time graduate research students from all U.S. universities pursuing degrees in earth sciences, biological sciences, engineering, geography, planning and resources management, and economics. There are multiple scholarships, and so criteria will vary by award. In general, the

Foundation will support research advancing Everglades physical, chemical or biological processes, or research in economic impacts of environmental changes.
