NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship

Deadline: Continuous, waiting for future months application to open

The NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship is a Congressional Black Caucus Foundation, Inc. (CBCF) program designed to give young, Black professionals the opportunity to work in Congress and with the Foundation to address social justice and racial equity issues that affect the Black community. Distinguished by two six-month rotations, Social Justice Fellows are placed in the U.S. Congress with Congressional Black Caucus members and the CBCF's Center for Policy Analysis and Research (CPAR) for a total of 12 months.

CBCF Fellowship Program

Deadline: Continuous, waiting for future months application to open

CBCF Offers three Fellowship Types:

1) Congressional Fellows: John R. Lewis Social Justice Fellows

Congressional and NREI Fellows are placed in the Senate, House of Representatives and other select offices to become the next generation of leaders in public service. The program is an intensive 12-month policy training and leadership development program which enables Fellows to receive hands-on public policy training as full-time legislative aides and policy analysts.

Amount: \$60,000-\$70,000

2) Research Fellows: CPAR Transportation Equity Fellow (Sponsored by State Farm) *(one full year conducting research with CPAR).

Finally, CBCF also offers Research Fellowships, which are an opportunity to engage in a one-year research Fellowship with our Center for Policy Analysis and Research. This opportunity does not include a rotation in a Congressional office, as applies with the Congressional and NREI Fellowship Opportunities.

Section I: SCHOLARSHIPS

July

Matthew Nicosia Scholarship

Deadline: July 10, 2024 **Amount:** \$1,000

The Matthew Nicosia scholarship decides to support the future generation of talented students by offering a scholarship to qualified applicants pursuing academic degrees. Our team has designed this essay contest-based scholarship to alleviate the financial costs associated with their campus-based degree.

Joy Cappel Scholarship

Deadline: July 20, 2024

Amount: \$2,500

The Joy Cappel Scholarship will award two life sciences students with \$2,500 each. The scholarship is intended to foster a new generation of researchers and help support these young investigators in their scientific training. For more than 30 years, Rockland was guided by Joy Cappel, President and CEO. Mrs. Cappel's vision to help define mechanisms underlying cell function and disease through antibody targeted detection is the motivational force behind this scholarship. The application must be submitted by July 20th for fall semester or by January 20th for spring semester of the current year.

David Pruitt Award For Courage

Deadline: July 31, 2024

Amount: \$2,500

The David Pruitt Award for Courage is a scholarship program designed to support high school seniors who have faced adversity and are embarking on their college journey for the upcoming academic year.

Sallie Mae Scholarship

Deadline: July 31, 2024

Amount: \$2,000

Sallie Mae is offering a straightforward monthly scholarship opportunity, awarding \$2,000 to eligible entrants. No essays or account sign-ups are required—just a simple scholarship for individuals seeking financial assistance for their education.

HUSTLE Hearts Foundation Scholarship

Deadline: July 31, 2024

Amount: \$1,000

HUSTLE Hearts Foundation Scholarships are awarded in July for the fall semester, and checks will be distributed to the college by August 22nd. Three scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 & \$500 will be

awarded. Applicants must submit their high school transcript, two letters of recommendation, a resume and an essay on their personal career goals in 250 or fewer words. Applicants must be first-generation college students. Founded in 2021, The HUSTLE Hearts Foundation supports outstanding Latino students with scholarships to complete higher education, while empowering students to be a trailblazer and make an impact in their community. The HUSTLE Hearts Foundation strives to make college education a top priority for every Latino student. Completed applications and all attachments must be received by July 31st for consideration.

August

WWF Conservation Leadership Award

Deadline: August 1, 2024

Amount: \$5,000

The WWF-US Youth Conservation Leadership Award celebrates the achievements of exceptional young people working toward conservation solutions in the United States. It seeks to inspire other young people to get involved in opportunities within their communities.

Men of Principle Scholarship

Deadline: August 1, 2024

Amount: \$1,000

The Men of Principle Scholarship, offered by Beta Theta Pi, recognizes non-Greek male students who embody the fraternity's values- Mutual Assistance, Intellectual Growth, Trust, Responsible Conduct, and Integrity. Eligible applicants do not need to join the fraternity to qualify for this scholarship. Each chapter or colony sets its own deadlines for the application process. For campus-specific inquiries, applicants should reach out to their Beta Theta Pi Chapter/Colony President.

Michael Moody Fitness Schoalrship

Deadline: August 1, 2024

Amount: \$1,500

The Michael Moody Fitness Scholarship offers \$1,500 to a high school senior, undergraduate, or graduate student who has demonstrated outstanding achievement, participation, and leadership in school activities and work experience, and interest in pursuing a career in the health and fitness-related fields. The student may apply and use the money for education-related expenses, including tuition, fees, books, supplies, room, and board.

SWING Scholarship

Deadline: August 1, 2024

Amount: \$500

SWING Scholarship Applicants must complete and submit a SWING Scholarship application; be female; be a woman of color and submit proof of current enrollment status as a full-time student at an accredited institution of higher education (i.e. college, university, or technical institute) for the upcoming school year.

The Mahoney Family Foundation Scholarship

Deadline: August 1, 2024

Amount: \$5,000

The Mahoney Family Foundation provides scholarships for graduate degrees for nurses and teachers. Applicants must be currently employed as a full-time nurse or teacher (paraprofessionals are ineligible) with at least three years experience and be a US citizen or permanent US resident. Scholarships will be awarded three times per year - Spring, Summer, and Fall Semesters- and will be paid directly to the school/organization providing the education/training.

Nancy Hall Memorial Scholarship

Deadline: August 14, 2024

Amount: \$5,000

The Nancy Hall Memorial Scholarship was created to offer financial aid to women who are pursuing careers in material handling, warehousing and heavy equipment. This scholarship is open to any students that are located within the United States and are either entering or are currently enrolled in college in the year the scholarship is awarded. The student must express an interest in pursuing a career in material handling/warehousing in their application.

WiNUP Professional Development Scholarship

Deadline: August 15, 2024

Any member interested in applying for the scholarship MUST complete the Member Professional Development Scholarship application form. The application form is found in the Member Section on the website. The applicant will be notified by September 15 and announced at conference. Applications received after August 15 will be considered for the following year's scholarship. The scholarships are designed for degree or non-degree study. Non-degree study would include professional development programs and workshops that have associated participation costs such as public speaking, PMP, graphic design, accounting/excel courses.

Section II: FELLOWSHIPS/AWARDS

National Endowment for the Humanities

Fellowships support individuals pursuing advanced research that is of value to humanities scholars, general audiences, or both. Recipients usually produce articles, monographs, books, digital materials, archaeological site reports, translations, editions, or other scholarly resources in the humanities. Projects may be at any stage of development.

July

Fellowships Open Book Program

Deadline: July 10, 2024

Maximum award amount: \$6,600

The Fellowships Open Book Program is a limited competition designed to make outstanding humanities books digitally available to a wide audience. By taking advantage of low-cost e-book technology, the program will allow teachers, students, scholars, and the public to read humanities books that can be downloaded or redistributed for no charge. This program is open to publishers who have published within the last seven years (or will publish during the period of performance) a book supported by one of the following NEH programs.

Humanities Collections and Reference Resources

Deadline: July 16, 2024

Maximum award amount: Planning= \$50,000 & Implementation= \$350,000

HCRR advances scholarship, education, and public engagement in the humanities by helping libraries, archives, museums, and historical organizations across the country steward important collections of books and manuscripts, photographs, sound recordings and moving images, archaeological and ethnographic artifacts, art and material culture, and digital objects. NEH encourages collaboration between smaller and larger repositories, as well as between humanities experts, information professionals, and community stakeholders to expand participation in cultural heritage and promote engagement with primary sources. You should prioritize methods that allow for sharing and the interoperability of information and resources to ensure their long-term availability.

<u>August</u>

Public Scholars

Deadline: August 28, 2024

Maximum award amount: \$5,000 per month

The Public Scholars program offers grants to individual authors for research, writing, travel, and other activities leading to the creation and publication of well-researched nonfiction books in the humanities written for the broad public. Writers with or without an academic affiliation may apply, and no advanced degree is required. The program encourages non-academic writers to deepen their engagement with the humanities by strengthening the research underlying their books, and it encourages academic writers in the

humanities to communicate the significance of their research to the broadest possible range of readers. NEH especially encourages applications from independent writers, researchers, scholars, and journalists.

Graduate Education in the Humanities: A National Convening

Deadline: August 6, 2024

Maximum award amount: \$500,000

Graduate Education in the Humanities: A National Convening will support the design, development, and implementation of a national convening on the state of, and prospects for, higher education in the humanities. Under the direction of a steering committee and related working groups, the national convening will provide participants the opportunity to explore current challenges and share best practices; offer guidance for graduate programs, departments, and other interested stakeholders; and help develop a strategic vision for graduate education in the humanities. In addition, the recipient will publish and disseminate a report based on the findings of the steering committee, working groups, and national convening.

Fellowship Programs at Independent Research Institutions

Deadline: August 14, 2024

Maximum award amount: up to \$565,000

The Fellowship Programs at Independent Research Institutions (FPIRI) program supports institutions that provide fellowships for advanced humanities research in the U.S. and abroad, foster communities of intellectual exchange among participating scholars, and provide access to resources that might otherwise not be available to the participating scholars. In evaluating applications, consideration is given to the library holdings, archives, special collections, and other resources—either on site or nearby—that institutions make available to fellows. FPIRI fellowship tenure must be continuous and last from four to twelve months. Residential fellows are expected to be in residence during their entire tenure period and to work on their projects on a full-time basis. Likewise, nonresidential NEH-funded fellows are expected to work on their projects on a full-time basis. If a fellow is obliged through special circumstances to depart before the end of the tenure period, he/she shall receive a prorated stipend.

The Public Humanities Projects Program

Deadline: August 14, 2024

Maximum award amount: up to \$1,000,000

The Public Humanities Projects program supports projects that bring the ideas of the humanities to life for general audiences through public programming. Public Humanities Projects supports projects in three categories (Exhibitions, Historic Places, and Humanities Discussions), and at two funding levels (Planning and Implementation). Proposed projects may include complementary components: for example, a museum exhibition might be accompanied by a website or mobile app.

Media Projects

Deadline: August 14, 2024

Maximum award amount: up to \$1,000,000

The Media Projects program supports the development, production, and distribution of radio programs, podcasts, documentary films, and documentary film series that engage general audiences with humanities

ideas in creative and appealing ways. Projects must be grounded in humanities scholarship and demonstrate an approach that is thoughtful, balanced, and analytical. Media Projects offers two levels of funding: Development and Production.
