WRNS Studio Foundation Architecture Scholarship

The WRNS Studio Foundation Architecture Scholarship is designed to support students who identify as Black or African-American. Eligibility is confirmed through both self-certification and within letters of reference. This scholarship provides financial assistance to full-time students pursuing degrees in architecture or design. This scholarship is available to full-time students pursuing degrees in architecture or design at approved accredited 5-year or 4+1 programs in the continental United States and Hawaii.

Amount: Varies

Deadline: February 29, 2024

Alabama Golf Association Women's Scholarship Fund

Alabama Golf Association Women's Scholarship Fund recipients must attend an accredited college or university and must be enrolled as full-time students carrying a class load of no less than 12 hours per academic semester or quarter unless written permission is obtained from the AGAWSF prior to the commencement of the semester or quarter. Scholarship recipients must maintain a minimum of a C+ (2.4 out of 4 point) their freshman year and a B- (2.8 out of 4) thereafter, Scholarship recipients must submit a copy of their grades to the Alabama Golf Association's (AGA) Director of Women's Golf immediately upon receipt of the same. This may be done by email, fax or mail.

Prior to entering college, the recipient shall furnish the AGA's Director of Women's Golf the school they are attending, student ID number, the contact person in the Financial Aid Office and their address as well as when the tuition is due. The recipient shall sign a release form in the Registrar's Office of the college enabling the AGA Scholarship Committee to receive reports on the recipient's academic performance. Scholarship recipients must remain a bona fide resident of the state of Alabama through college graduation. Scholarship recipients must submit any change in home address, telephone number, current school address, major and graduation date to the AGA Director of Women's Golf.

Arthritis Champions Scholarship

To be eligible for the Arthritis Champions Scholarship, applicants must: be a U.S. citizen or a legal and permanent resident; have doctor-diagnosed arthritis or related rheumatic disease; be classified as a full-time undergraduate,

graduate or medical student at an accredited college or university in the United States for the entire academic year; be enrolled full-time each semester and have completed the full-time units to reapply for the next academic year; have and maintain a 2.5 GPA; and be engaged as an Arthritis Foundation advocate, fundraiser, participant, volunteer and/or supporter and/or other service to benefit the arthritis community.

Amount: \$20,000

Deadline: March 1, 2024

Engebretson Foundation Scholarship

The Engebretson Foundation Scholarship is awarded yearly to a US graduating high school senior who demonstrates not only financial need but also impressive academic performance and leadership ability. Applicants must have an ACT of 28 or an SAT of 1240, and 3.75 GPA or above and/or top 5% of graduating class. Applicants must plan to attend a four-year college and demonstrate financial need.

Amount: \$20,000

Deadline: March 1, 2024

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program

The U.S. Department of State's Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program enables students of limited financial means to study or intern abroad, providing them with skills critical to our national security and economic prosperity. To be eligible for the Gilman Program, applicants must be receiving a Federal Pell Grant during the time of application or provide proof that they will be receiving a Pell Grant during the term of their study abroad program or internship.

Award recipients are chosen by a competitive selection process and must use the award to defray eligible study or intern abroad costs. These costs include program tuition, room and board, books, local transportation, insurance, international airfare, passport and visa fees. Gilman scholars are eligible for 12 months of noncompetitive eligibility (NCE) hiring status within the federal government, with the possibility of extensions if certain criteria are met.

Amount: \$5,000

CBCF Fellowship Program

Congressional and NREI Fellows are placed in the Senate, House of Representatives and other select offices to become the next generation of leaders in public service. The program is an intensive 12-month policy training and leadership development program which enables Fellows to receive hands-on public policy training as full-time legislative aides and policy analysts. CBCF Fellowship discipline areas include Health, Cybersecurity, Aerospace/Defense, Diversity & Technology, Finance & Economics, Foreign Policy, Energy, Environment Sustainability, and more. Applicants of all backgrounds will be considered for this opportunity.

Amount: \$60,000-\$70,000

NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship

The NREI John R. Lewis Social Justice Policy Fellowship is a Congressional Black Caucus Foundation, Inc. (CBCF) program designed to give young, Black professionals the opportunity to work in Congress and with the Foundation to address social justice and racial equity issues that affect the Black community. Distinguished by two six-month rotations, Social Justice Fellows are placed in the U.S. Congress with Congressional Black Caucus members and the CBCF's Center for Policy Analysis and Research (CPAR) for a total of 12 months.

Fellows produce social justice policy research and analysis on topics that include, but not limited to, criminal justice reform, education, community/economic development, health equity, and civil rights. While working in Congressional Black Caucus member offices, Fellows gain invaluable legislative experience as they engage in the development of public policy initiatives, attend briefings, conduct research, write speeches, and develop rapport with key leaders all in the areas of social justice. In the Center for Policy Analysis and Research, Fellows work under the NREI Director and in cooperation with other stakeholders to conduct policy analysis, research, and data collection with the goal to disseminate research findings and relevant information to advance NREI's mission. Fellows during their term may also organize social justice forums and brain trusts, serve as an expert in their field, and produce issue briefs, fact sheets and other publications related to social justice.

Amount: \$70,000

February Scholarships

AMS Scholarship for Underserved Communities

Applicants must be U.S. citizens or hold permanent resident status. Students who will be entering their freshman year of college in the fall are eligible to apply. Students must plan to pursue careers in the atmospheric or related oceanic and hydrologic sciences. Marine Biology is not eligible. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Students eligible to apply for the AMS Scholarship for Underserved Communities may also apply to the AMS Freshman Scholarship Program but can only accept one scholarship if selected for both.

Amount: \$6,000

Deadline: February 23, 2024

Gertrude M. Cox Scholarship

The Cox Scholarship, sponsored by the ASA Committee on Women in Statistics and Caucus for Women in Statistics, was established in 1989 to encourage more women to enter statistically oriented professions. Two scholarship recipients are selected each year: one to a woman in or entering the early stages of graduate training (MS or PhD) and one to a woman in a more advanced stage of training. The application is limited to women who are citizens or permanent residents of the United States or Canada and who are admitted to full-time study in a graduate statistics program by July 1 of the award year.

Amount: \$1,000

Deadline: February 23, 2024

MathWorks Math Modeling (M3 Challenge)

MathWorks Math Modeling (M3 Challenge) is a contest for teams of high school juniors and seniors in the U.S. and sixth form students in England and Wales. Through participation in this competition, students experience what it's like to work as a team to tackle a real-world problem under time and resource constraints, akin to those faced by professional mathematicians working in the industry. Teams of 11th and 12th graders from anywhere in the United States, including territories and DoDEA schools, and sixth form students (age 16-19) in England and Wales may participate. The competition is fully virtual, and participants will not be charged a registration or participation fee.

Deadline: February 23, 2024

VPC Community Involvement and Kathleen Eovino Memorial Scholarship

The VPC Community Involvement Scholarship is awarded to high school seniors or college students who will be continuing their education in the fall at a vocational/technical, two-year, or four-year college. Applicants must have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale at the time of application. The winners will be those applicants who best demonstrate service to and involvement with their "communities" - defined broadly as a geographic community, school community, or sports/hobby/activity community.

Amount: \$2,000

Deadline: February 23, 2024

Honorable William C Conner Writing Competition

The Honorable William C. Conner Writing Competition was established to recognize exceptionally written papers that are submitted by law students and is presented each year at the Annual Meeting and Awards Dinner. The competition is open to students enrolled in a J.D. or LL.M. program (day or evening). The subject matter must be directed to one of the traditional subject areas of intellectual property, i.e., patents, trademarks, copyrights, trade secrets, unfair trade practices, antitrust, and data security/privacy issues.

Amount: \$2,500

Deadline: February 25, 2024

Joseph James Morelli Legacy Foundation Scholarship

Awardees may apply the scholarship funds toward tuition, books, testing, tutoring, assistive technology and/or other resources required to obtain accommodations. Applicants must be either a high school student or a post-high school student, who will be attending an accredited undergraduate school, technical school, or community college in the United States in the Fall of the year the scholarship is awarded. Graduate students are not eligible. Applicants must be pursuing a degree in STEM field (science, technology, engineering, math) and must have a demonstrated learning challenge (disability) of dyslexia or similar reading and/or language-based disability. Dyscalculia, dysgraphia, or ADHD alone do not qualify. Applications open in January and awards are announced at the end of May.

Amount: \$2,500

Deadline: February 25, 2024

NASF Foundation Scholarships

The scholarship award is available to both undergraduates and graduates. Undergraduate applicants must be junior standing or above when applying and must be of senior standing for the next academic year. Undergraduate and graduate students must be studying in chemical engineering, material science or engineering, mechanical engineering, metallurgical engineering, environmental engineering, or chemistry. The applicant must be attending an accredited college. Only students attending college/university in the United States are invited to apply.

Amount: \$1,500

Deadline: February 25, 2024

William L. Cullison Scholarship

To be eligible for the William L. Cullison Scholarship, applicants must: be undergraduate students with a major in a pulp and paper science course of study at a college or university; have completed at least one full undergraduate academic year of studies; have earned a 3.5 GPA through the first two years in a four or five year program; demonstrate outstanding leadership abilities; and demonstrate significant interest in the pulp and paper industry which could include listing previous, current or future industry internships.

Amount: \$4,000

Deadline: February 25, 2024

AEC Aluminum Extrusion Design Competition

The International Aluminum Extrusion Design Competition is not just a competition; it's a call to envision a world transformed by innovative design and sustainable solutions. Hosted by the Aluminum Extruders Council (AEC) and the ET Foundation, this competition invites designers and engineers worldwide to unleash their creativity and demonstrate how aluminum extrusions can lead us to a more sustainable future.

Amount: \$5,000

Deadline: February 26, 2024

Feeding Tomorrow Scholarships

The Feeding Tomorrow Fund annually awards scholarships to students dedicated to pursuing all levels of degrees (including doctorates) in various science of food disciplines. Please review the available scholarships, ensuring eligibility and adherence to application requirements. Most awards are \$1,500, with the top-ranking recipient of the Feeding Tomorrow Fund General Scholarship Award receiving \$5,000.

Amount: \$5,000

Deadline: February 26, 2024

Scholars Helping Collars Scholarship

P.L.A.Y. has always made a point to promote compassion towards animals in both our personal and professional lives. Students from across the U.S. are invited to apply for P.L.A.Y.'s annual Scholars Helping Collars Scholarship. Action for Nature International Young Eco-Hero Award

Winners receive a cash prize of up to \$500, a special certificate of achievement, public recognition on our website and in the media, as well as exclusive access to our Eco-Hero Alumni Facebook Group. Please read the Application Guidelines to see if you are eligible to apply to become a Young Eco-Hero. If you or someone you know is eligible, encourage them to apply.

American Airlines Education Foundation Scholarship

We consider students for scholarships in separate categories depending on country of residence. An independent selection committee evaluates the applications and selects recipients by: academic achievement (grade point average, class rank and academic awards/honors); demonstration of community service; and activities (participation in school and non-school activities; leadership roles on athletic teams or in other activities; and employment history). Applicants who want to demonstrate financial need must also submit a FAFSA.

Amount: \$2,500

Deadline: February 28, 2024

ICSC Foundation Graduate Scholarship

Multiple scholarships are available for graduate students. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents, enrolled full-time at an accredited university in the fall of the year the scholarship is offered, and have a minimum 3.0 GPA. Individual scholarships requirements vary.

Amount: \$10,000

Deadline: February 28, 2024

Indian Health Service Scholarships

The Indian Health Service (IHS) offers three scholarships for American Indian and Alaska Native students in order to educate and train health professionals to staff Indian health programs. Criteria will vary slightly by scholarship. Applicants must meet specific eligibility requirements: be a high school graduate or the equivalent; have a minimum 2.0 GPA; be capable of completing a health profession degree program; and intend to serve Indian people as a health professional in your chosen discipline. Dollar amounts will vary.

Amount: Varies

Deadline: February 28, 2024

KFC Foundation Scholarships

To be eligible for the KFC Foundation Scholarships, applicants must: have graduated from high school, earned their high school equivalency/GED or will graduate from high school in May; be enrolled in an accredited trade school, college or graduate school for the fall; have a 2.5 GPA (if applying for the \$5,000 or \$2,500 scholarship) or a 3.5 GPA (if applying for the \$20,000 scholarship); and be a KFC employee in good standing and be participating in the KFC Foundation's Franchise Donation Program.

Amount: \$20,000

Deadline: February 28, 2024

NAWIC Construction Trades Scholarship

To be eligible for the Construction Trades Scholarship, applicants must be currently enrolled in a constructionrelated training program which is approved by the Bureau of Apprenticeship Training, community college, technical school or equivalent. Scholarships are not automatically renewed. Students will be considered for subsequent awards if they provide evidence of continued need, continued interest in construction, and continued enrollment and good standing in a construction-related field.

Amount: Varies

To be eligible, applicants must be: US residents; be either an incoming freshman, current undergraduate or graduate student; have a 3.75 GPA if an incoming freshman or a 3.5 GPA if in any other grade; provide a FAFSA form (maximum EFC # of \$15,000 as shown on FAFSA); provide two recommendation letters (one that focuses on academics and one that speaks to your participation in extra-curricular, association/community or employment activities that reflect your commitment to advance involvement of women in engineering); and demonstrate a commitment to increase the involvement of women in engineering and encourage girls/women to pursue STEM studies/careers through substantial involvement/leadership in school, work, community, club, volunteer, or mentorship activities.

Amount: \$5,000

Deadline: February 28, 2024

Tau Beta Pi/SAE Engineering Scholarship

To be eligible, applicants must: be a U.S. resident; be an incoming freshman; have a 3.75 GPA; pursue an engineering or related science degree through an ABET accredited program; provide two letters of recommendation (one that focuses on academics and one that speaks to your involvement in extra-curricular activities or employment); and detail their participation in a community service project during their junior or senior year that is not related to a high school project.

Amount: \$1,500

Western Reserve Herb Society Scholarships

The Western Reserve Herb Society offers Plant Science scholarships. These are open to students who have completed the second/sophomore year of undergraduate study and are pursuing a Bachelor degree. APSA Diversity Fellowship Program

The APSA Diversity Fellowship Program is a fellowship competition for individuals from underrepresented backgrounds applying to or in the early stages of doctoral programs in political science.
