SCHOLARSHIP ALERT!

KnowBe4 Scholarship for Black Americans in Cybersecurity

The recipient of the KnowBe4 Scholarship for Black Americans in Cybersecurity must be Black or African American and pursuing or planning to pursue a degree with a focus on cybersecurity or information assurance. GPA must be at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale. Applicant must be a US citizen or permanent resident. Complete applications must include a resume/CV, unofficial transcripts, one letter of recommendation, and essay question responses.

You may attend courses on-campus or online, and be enrolled full-time or part-time at an institution in the US. This one-time award may be applied to tuition, fees, books, electronics and up to \$3,000 may be applied to oncampus housing. Scholarships may be paid all at once or spread out over multiple semesters including summer sessions. For more information or to apply, please visit the scholarship provider's website.

Corris Boyd Scholars Program

HCA is proud to sponsor the HCA Corris Boyd Scholars Program. This program was established in honor of a healthcare leader who dedicated his life to diversity and excellence in leadership – especially among people of color. The recipient will receive a \$40,000 scholarship towards tuition and other expenses at the AUPHA full-member graduate school program of his or her choice. The award will be paid in four installments (August and December of the first year, then August and December of the second year). Students enrolled in accelerated programs will not receive the 2nd year installments until the dates noted above.

At the time of award, applicants must have applied and been accepted into an AUPHA Full Member master's degree program for start in Fall, but not before August 1st. Search the AUPHA Online Directory for eligible member programs. Under "Program Accreditation/Certification", select the box for "CAHME Accredited

Graduate Programs". Scroll down the screen and select "Find a Program". Then scroll down the screen to see the list of eligible programs.

Applicants must be a full-time student of one of the following races: African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian American, Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, Latino/Hispanic, Multiracial. Must have a minimum 3.0 GPA (out of 4.0) in undergraduate coursework and have US citizenship or permanent resident status. Gloria Barron Wilderness Society Scholarship

Graduate students meeting the eligibility requirements noted below may apply directly to The Wilderness Society. Applicants must be enrolled in an accredited graduate institution in North America, have strong academic qualifications and/or career goals focused on making a significant positive difference in the long-term protection of wilderness in the United States. Graduate students in natural resources management, law or policy programs are strongly encouraged to apply.

Research topics include restoration of the health and function of wilderness, management impacts on wildland, valuing wildlands ecosystems, connecting people to wildlands, and impacts of climate change. Additional funding will be provided to pay travel expenses for the recipient to work with staff members of The Wilderness Society on this project. The Society wishes to encourage the publication of this work in an academic journal or other appropriate medium and has additional funds to help cover expenses of publishing and publicizing the final paper. Create Real Impact Contest

Time to get creative and speak out about the #1 killer of young people! The Create Real Impact Contest calls on students, ages 14-22, to showcase their solutions and strategies to stop the #1 killer of young people–car crashes

caused by reckless and distracted driving. Students submit one entry into one of the four categories: creative writing, video, graphic design, or music. We have individual grand-prize winners in each category and the opportunity to win money through bonus points!

In addition to the individual winners, we have another exciting category for teachers and advisors: a distracted driving social media campaign. This is an opportunity for high school teachers and advisors to oversee student leaders' efforts in implementing a social media campaign around distracted driving. Women in Transition Scholarship

The Women In Transition scholarship was designed for women who have become the primary source of support for themselves and their families and wish to return to school to obtain a degree in accounting. This is available to incoming or current freshmen, and women returning to school with a freshman status who demonstrate financial need. This scholarship is renewable upon a 3.0 GPA. Applicants must be female US citizens attending accredited US schools pursuing an accounting degree.

Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to the goal of pursuing a degree in accounting in preparation for a career as an accounting or finance professional, including evidence of continued commitment to this goal after receiving the award. In addition, an aptitude in accounting and business as evidenced by prior course work and/or work experience and clear evidence that goals and a plan for achieving those goals, both personal and professional, have been established.

Amount: \$16,000
