## Congresswoman Sewell Honors PFC Julian Colvin on House Floor

On August 2, I had the privilege to honor and pay tribute to the life and service of Alabama's own, fallen soldier, Army Private First Class (PFC) Julian L. Colvin. PFC Colvin was a dedicated solider assigned to the 508<sup>th</sup> Special Troops Battalion, 4<sup>th</sup> Brigade Combat Team, 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division from Fort Bragg, NC. PFC Colvin lost his life on July 22<sup>nd</sup>, while supporting Operation Enduring Freedom in Kandahar, Afghanistan at the young age of 21. Our nation is eternally grateful for PFC Julian Colvin's dedicated service and patriotism. This brave solider has left an indelible mark on our nation and his service and legacy will forever remain in our hearts and memories.
