

#### **Constituent Services Success Story**

A Veteran from Perry County contacted our Montgomery office in early February because his veteran's benefits had been abruptly cut off. He had received a letter from the Veterans Administration (VA) notifying him he was "deceased" according to records. Our staff worked with the VA to verify that the constituent was not deceased and to restore his benefits in a timely manner. While the VA returned the gentleman to "living" status immediately, his benefits were not restored. We contacted the VA again to request that they retroactively restore the benefits lost by the veteran and two business days later, the VA honored our request and restored the benefits.
