Rep. Sewell Launches Oral History Project

Washington, D.C. – Congresswoman Terri Sewell (AL-7) is launching an Oral History Project to preserve the legacies of the brave men and women who took part in the marches from Selma to Montgomery in 1965.

This is a year-long partnership with Alabama State University, Miles College, and the University of Alabama. College student volunteers will identify potential interview subjects, conduct video interviews, and archive footage. The Oral History Project is an excellent opportunity for these students to connect with their local communities and learn about Alabama's rich civil rights history while preserving it for future generations.

“This initiative will honor the bravery and courage of our Foot Soldiers. As we approach the 50th commemoration of Bloody Sunday, we must recommit to never forgetting the contributions of those before us. This endeavor will preserve the story of America's Civil Rights District,” said **Rep. Sewell**. “I am thrilled that students from Alabama State University, Miles College, and the University of Alabama will have the opportunity to connect with their local communities and learn about Alabama's rich civil rights history, all while preserving the history of voting rights for future generations.”

“The Voting Rights Movement that led to the Selma to Montgomery historic march is a dynamic freedom movement that -- 50 years later -- must not only be celebrated, but researched and taught to ensure that our country continues to hold true to its democratic principles of freedom and justice. Alabama State University congratulates Rep. Sewell for her work to preserve and protect this history that will be gathered from those who were on the front lines of this non-violent movement that resulted in national voting rights legislation for all Americans,” said **Dr. Janice Franklin, Dean of Alabama State's Levi Watkins Learning Center**.

“Students from Miles College have always been at the forefront in the fight for civil rights. We are thrilled for the opportunity to participate in the recording of the accounts of various Foot Soldiers who were active in the fight for voting rights. The stories of these ‘invisible leaders’ would give us a deeper understanding of the past and motivate us to face current and future challenges with courage and hope. We thank Rep. Sewell for initiating and implementing this great project. REP. SEWELL SEEKS TO STRENGTHEN THE VOTING RIGHTS AMENDMENT ACT OF 2015

Washington, D.C. – Congresswoman Terri Sewell issued the following statement after the Voting Rights Amendment Act of 2015 was reintroduced in the House of Representatives:

“I am pleased that both Democrats and Republicans recognize the need to strengthen federal voter protections, however, I am deeply concerned that in its current form, the Voting Rights Amendment Act of 2015 would not cover the State of Alabama under the bill’s new Section 5 coverage formula.

“The new formula omits key states, like Alabama, and does not take into account consent decrees. Alabama has a storied history of voter suppression. Although progress has been made, it is largely due to the protections granted by the landmark Voting Rights Act of 1965. We have witnessed a steady erosion of voter protections in the wake of *Shelby County v. Holder* that prove federal oversight is still necessary.

“Last January, a federal judge reinstated federal oversight in the City of Evergreen, Alabama, using Section 3 of the Voting Rights Act which allows the courts to ‘bail in’ jurisdictions that have intentionally discriminated against minority voters. The City of Evergreen came under federal scrutiny for unfairly excluding African-Americans from the voting rolls, and for attempting to further dilute their voting power with a redistricting plan that would pack its majority black population into only two of five municipal districts.

“The State of Alabama has also enacted a proof-of-citizenship requirement and photo identification rules that makes it harder to vote. Imposing additional and unnecessary restrictions discourages young adults, the elderly, people of color, naturalized citizens, and low-income individuals from coming to the polls. We need to protect their voices, not silence them completely.

“The struggle to ensure that all Americans can participate equally in the political process continues. Voting rights advocates and everyday citizens must remain vigilant and do all they can to safeguard against efforts to constrict democracy in state, local, and federal elections and beyond. Our democracy requires it. On the 50th anniversary celebration of the Voting Rights Act, and the historic march that led to its passage, I urge my colleagues to make a commitment to work together across the aisles and restore the Voting Rights Act for all Americans.”

HOUSE PASSES CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDAL BILL TO HONOR VOTING RIGHTS MARCHERS

Washington, D.C. – Today, Congresswoman Terri Sewell applauded the unanimous passage of H.R. 431, a bipartisan bill she introduced to award a Congressional Gold Medal to the brave Foot Soldiers whose perilous journey from Selma to Montgomery led to the passage of the landmark Voting Rights Act of 1965.

“Voting is the most fundamental right we share as Americans. We owe a debt of gratitude to the brave Foot Soldiers who dared to march across the Edmund Pettus Bridge in the face of extreme racial hostility. We should never forget the sacrifices they made so this nation could live up to its ideals of equality and justice for all. The Congressional Gold medal is a great reminder of the power of ordinary Americans to collectively achieve extraordinary social change. This nation should never forget those who marched, prayed and died in the pursuit of civil and voting rights. While we can never truly repay the Foot Soldiers for the sacrifices they made, we can offer a down payment by continuing to fight against injustice wherever it exists,” said Rep. Terri Sewell.

“I am deeply humbled by the strong bipartisan support H.R. 431 received, and would like to thank Representative Martha Roby and all of the members of the Alabama Congressional delegation for standing with me in support of this bill. The Congressional Gold Medal should serve as a compelling reminder of the sacrifices that each and every Foot Soldier made so that all Americans could enjoy the fundamental rights guaranteed by the Constitution,” added Rep. Sewell.

Representative Martha Roby (R-AL), whose district includes parts of Montgomery, is an original sponsor of the bill along with Representative Sewell.

“I’m proud to be part of this bill to honor the legacy of the brave individuals who took a stand for equal rights in Alabama against brutality and oppression. I want to thank my friend, Terri Sewell for her leadership and hard work on this bill, and thanks as well to all who signed on as co-sponsors,” said Rep. Martha Roby.

About the Congressional Gold Medal

Since the American Revolution, Congress has commissioned gold medals as its highest expression of national appreciation for distinguished achievements and contributions by individuals or institutions. The medal was first awarded in 1776 by the second Continental Congress to General George Washington.

About the March from Selma to Montgomery in 1965

Civil rights activists were brutally attacked by Alabama state troopers on the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma on March 7, 1965. This day, now known as Bloody Sunday, was the first of three planned, peaceful protests from Selma to Montgomery. Nearly 2,500 Foot Soldiers led by Dr. Martin Luther King attempted a second march two days later on March 9, 1965, now known as “Turnaround Tuesday.” An estimated 8,000 Foot Soldiers left Selma on March 21, 1965, and successfully marched to Montgomery to peacefully protest restrictive voting laws that prevented African-Americans from voting in the South.

We Are the Bridge: Rural Development Carries Forward Civil Rights Legacy

Under Secretary for Rural Development Lisa Mensah stands at the head of the historical trail where marchers began their trek across the Edmund Pettus bridge enroute to Montgomery, Alabama seeking voting rights for African-Americans.

On my first trip as the Under Secretary for Rural Development, I visited Alabama and Mississippi. It seemed fitting for me to begin my trip in *Selma, Alabama* given the historical significance of the location. The march from Selma, led by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., embodied our most human desires: to be treated fairly, to be heard, to be treated with decency-to not be denied access and opportunities due to the color of our skin, our gender identity, our gender expression or our political identity.

I was raised in Oregon by my father, an immigrant from Ghana and my mother, an Iowa farm girl. Standing there in Selma, the sacrifices made by those before me came into focus. As an African-American woman, I'm now very honored to be at an agency that plays an important role in bringing new investments to rural America.

Here at USDA, we play a role in rebuilding communities when we provide help to a first-time homebuyer, or provide safe and sanitary housing for a renter. When a revolving loan fund helps expand a business and bring new jobs to town, or critical water and wastewater systems are installed, or high-speed internet connection comes online to a remote community. This is how we build on a continued pursuit of equality-striving for inclusion of all Americans.

I was heartened to have a tour of the Southern Classic Food Group, a condiment manufacturer in Brundidge, Alabama that is expanding their business and their market share with support from Rural Development. The Economic Development Center in Pike County, Alabama works in partnership with us to invest in local small businesses and create jobs.

In Winona, Mississippi I announced our investment of \$600,000 to seed a revolving loan fund for north central Mississippi small businesses, and I learned about a mental health center in Greenwood, Mississippi funded by our Community Facilities program that is touching thousands of lives every year. Improvements that strengthen and enhance the quality of life in rural communities often subject to great poverty.

As I stood on the edge of the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma, Alabama, I was struck by the fear and bravery it took for those marchers to cross it on that day in 1965. Though our nation is faced with challenges of the past and more subtle discrimination today, those who marched over the bridge made it possible for us to *be* the bridge-to rebuild trust and to challenge practices of exclusivity that have limited the extent to which we serve communities across our nation. Now, fifty years later, I know that we stand on the shoulders of giants who came before us as we work to develop and sustain our rural communities.

FY 2016 Appropriations Requests

Please find Congresswoman Sewell's fiscal year 2016 (FY16) appropriations request below.

Language Requests: a request to include specific bill or report language that does not direct funding to a particular entity but encourages, urges, or directs some type of action by an agency

Programmatic Requests: a request to fund a specific Federal program at a specified level

You will need to complete this form by Friday, March 6, 2015 at 5:00 p.m. If you have multiple requests please include all of the required information on a separate form.

As with previous years, earmarks have been banned, so only programmatic, bill, and report language requests are acceptable.

Here are some preliminary tips:

The House Rules define an earmark as --

a provision or report language included primarily at the request of a Member, Delegate, Resident Commissioner, or Senator providing, authorizing or recommending a specific amount of discretionary budget authority, credit authority, or other spending authority for a contract, loan, loan guarantee, grant, loan authority, or other expenditure with or to an entity, or targeted to a specific State, locality or Congressional district, other than through a statutory or administrative formula-driven or competitive award process.

These requests will not be accepted.

The President's FY16 budget was also recently released. Please use it as a reference in preparing your submission. It will help you easily find information regarding your federal programs of interest.




